THE UNIVERSITY OF PUERTO RICO IN PONCE

The UPR-Ponce is part of the UPR system and is the only public institution of higher education in the southern part of the island. Established as Ponce Regional College in 1969 and accredited by the Middle States Association since 1970, originally authorized to offer associate degrees and transfer programs, but added a number of baccalaureate degree programs beginning in the 1980's. It is located in the city of Ponce in the southern coast of Puerto Rico, approximately 67 miles from the capital city of San Juan.

The **Middle States Commission on Higher Education** (MSCHE) has accredited the UPR-Ponce since 1970; and reaffirmed accreditation in 2019. The next self-study evaluation will be in 2024-2025. The UPR-Ponce has the following professional accreditations for the academic programs: Accreditation of the Associate Degree Program in Physical Therapy by the **Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy** (CAPTE); accreditation of the Business Administration Program and Office Systems Program by the **Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs** (ACBSP); accreditation of the Computerized Information Systems Program by the **Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology** (ABET); and the accreditation of the Elementary Education Program by the **Council for the Accreditation of Educators Program** (CAEP). In addition, the **Association of College and Research Libraries** (ACRL) favorably recognized the Adelina Coppin Library, while the **International Association of Counseling Services** (IACS) re-accredited the Counseling and Psychological Services Office.

At present, the institution offers twelve bachelor's degrees, four associate degrees, and fifty-two articulated transfer programs to other UPR campuses. Total headcount enrollment for fall 2020-2021 was 2,382, of which ninety-three percent (93%) of the student population studies full time, 97% receives some form of financial aid, and 58% is female. Eighty-two percent (82%)

of the student body belongs to bachelor's degree programs, 6% to technical programs, and 10% in transfer programs. The remainder 2% was classified in other categories.

Approximately 204 faculty and 200 non-faculty staff members serve the student body. On average, the student/faculty ratio is 20:1. The 2020-2021 faculty profile revealed that 48% of faculty teaches full-time. Fifty-three per cent (53%) has doctoral degrees. Nineteen per cent (19%) of faculty holds the rank of professor, 13% associate professor, 35% assistant professor, and 33% instructor. UPR-Ponce has an operational budget of \$23,760,495 for academic year 2020-2021.

OUTSTANDING FACTS

This section gathers the most outstanding facts for this year's edition of the UPR-Ponce Annual Institutional Data Profile. This information covers academic, student, and administrative areas of the Institution for academic year 2020-2021. Among the most outstanding facts that emerge from this statistical information are the following, analyzed for the first semester of academic year 2020-2021.

- ✓ UPR-Ponce total headcount enrollment was 2,380; as compared to last year's enrollment, it evidences a decrease of ten percent (6%).
- ✓ Eighty-two percent (82%) of 2020-2021 total headcount enrollment belongs to baccalaureate degree programs, while 6% belongs to associate or technical degree and 10% to transfer programs of total headcount enrollment for the first semester.
- ✓ If compared to previous year, technical programs' total enrollment decreased by 14%, transfer program decreased by 11%, and baccalaureate program decreased by 4%.
- ✓ Total headcount enrollment decreased by 10% for the second semester of this academic year.
- ✓ The student retention rate was 80%. The past three-year average retention rate was 80% too.
- ✓ The baccalaureate program with a higher retention rate was Athletic Therapeutics (100%).
- ✓ The technical program with a higher retention rate (83%) was Physical Therapy.
- ✓ The six-year overall graduation rate was 48%, it increased 4% if compared to previous year. Graduation rate for students enrolled in a bachelor's degrees was 48%.
- ✓ Ninety-seven per cent (96%) of incoming freshmen entered with a high school index that fell between 3.00 and 4.00.
- ✓ Sixty-four per cent (64%) of incoming freshmen came from the public-school system.
- ✓ Of the baccalaureate degrees conferred (430) this year, the greatest number belonged to the Biomedical Sciences program, which constituted 21%.
- ✓ Of all technical degree conferred (61), the greatest number of degrees granted belongs to the Physical Therapy Program with 57%.
- ✓ Total degree conferred increased by 15%, if compared to previous year.

- ✓ Ninety-seven per cent (97%) of this academic year's total enrollment received some form of financial aid, including de pandemic funds.
- ✓ Forty-seven per cent (47%) of the 2019-2020 UPR-Ponce faculty hold a master's degree, while 53% hold doctorate degrees.
- ✓ Faculty average teaching load for academic year 2019-2020 ranged from 11.95 to 16.10 credit hours.
- ✓ UPR-Ponce's budget for 2020-2021 was \$23,760,495, evidencing an increase by 2.5 million (12%), if compared to previous year budget.

UNIVERSITY OF PUERTO RICO IN PONCE

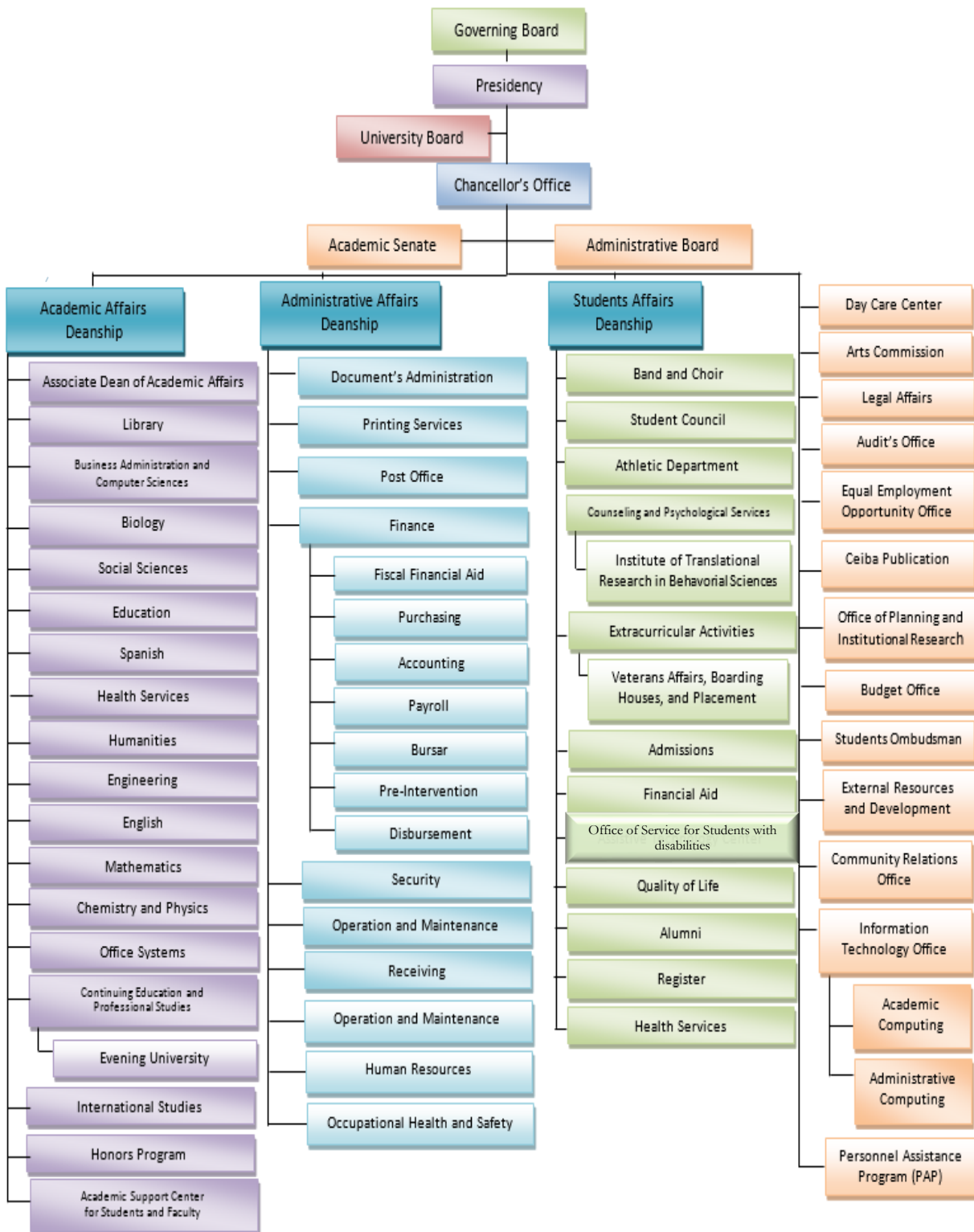

TOTAL ENROLLMENT OF BACCALAUREATE PROGRAMS

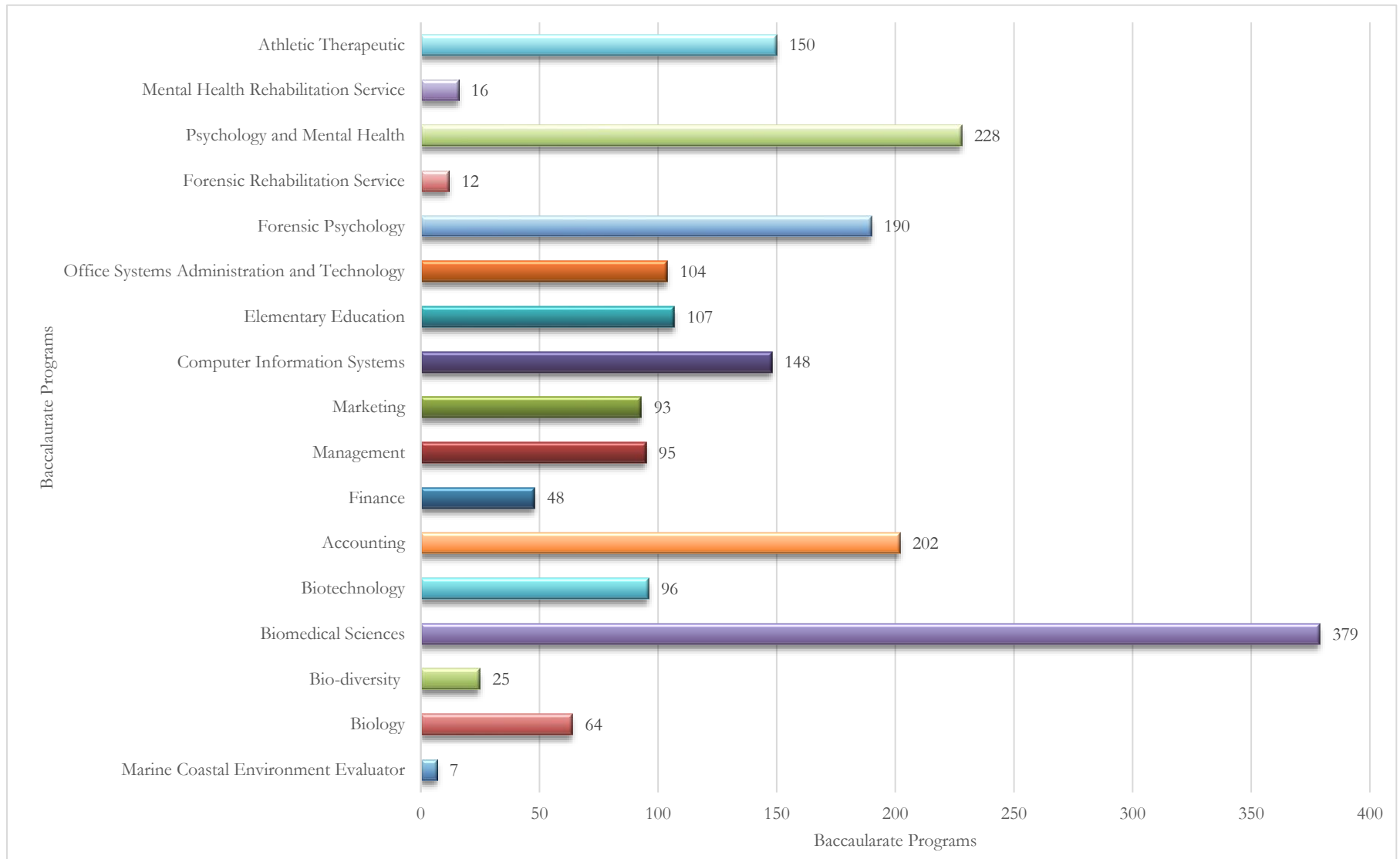

TOTAL ENROLLMENT OF TECHNICAL PROGRAMS

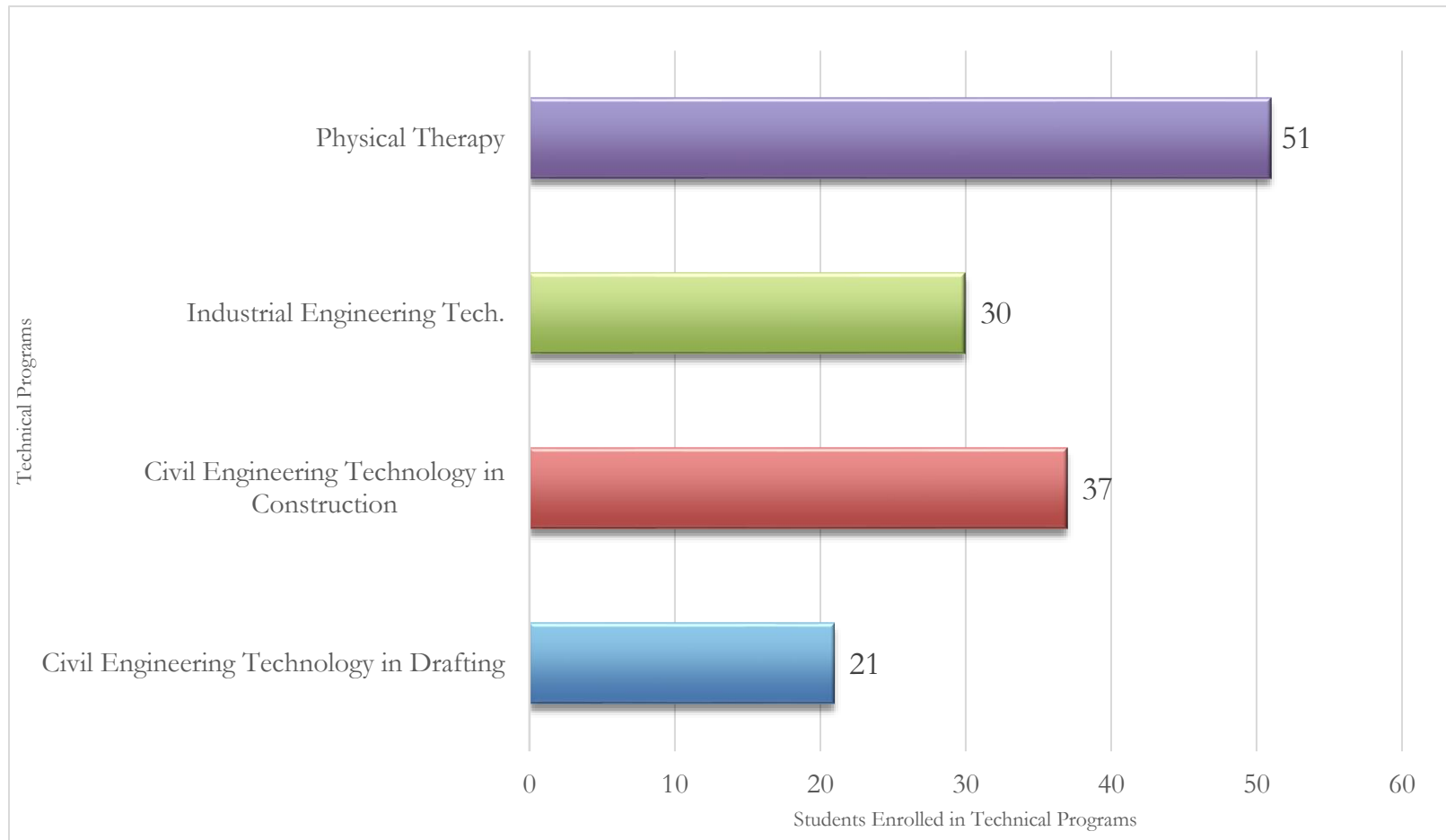

TOTAL ENROLLMENT OF TRANSFER PROGRAMS

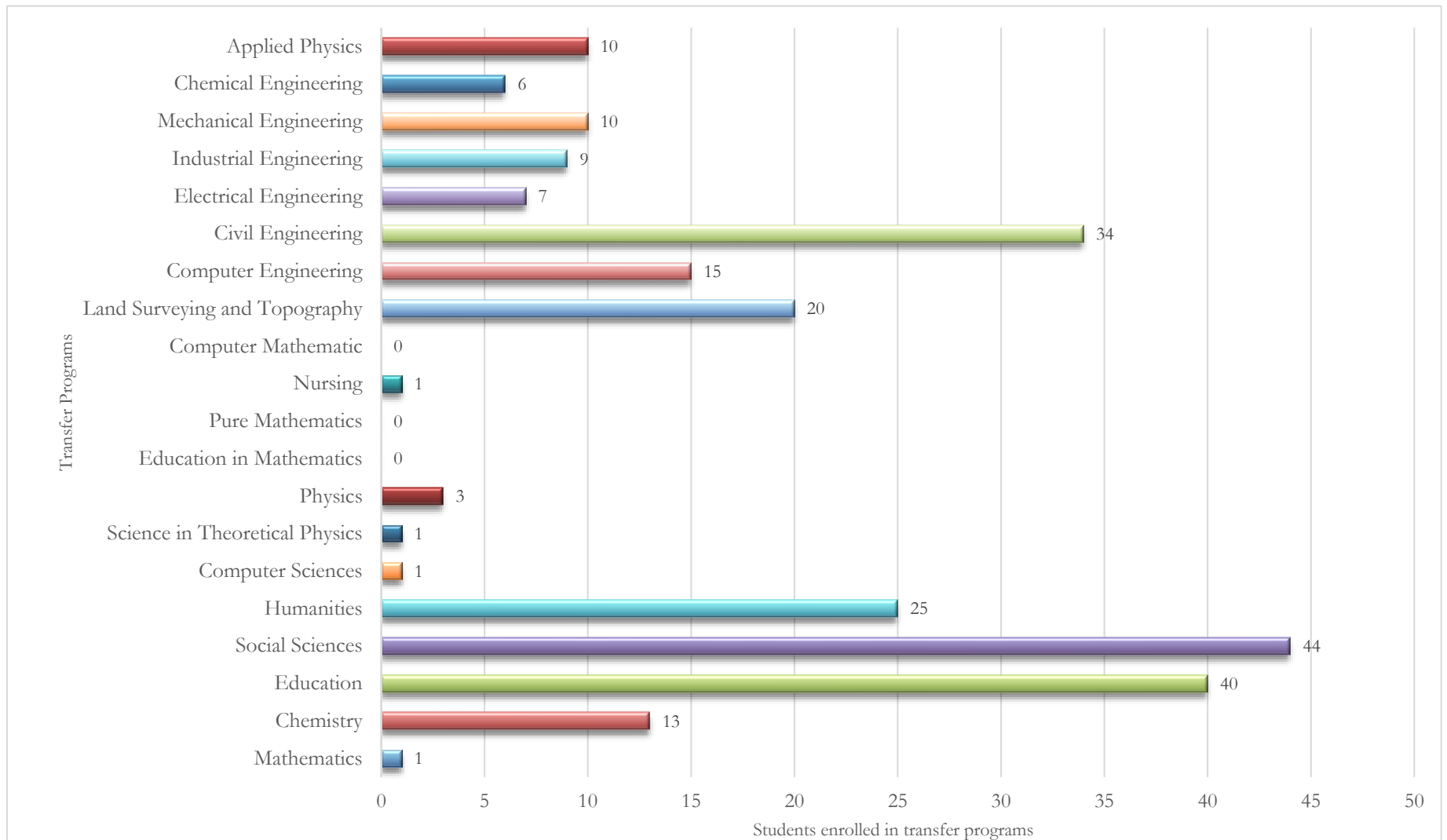

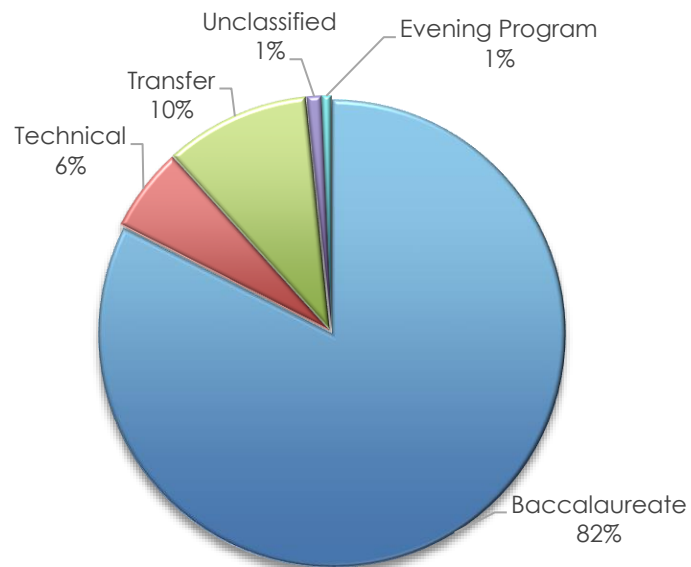
ENROLLMENT DISTRIBUTION BY TYPE OF PROGRAMS

SECOND SEMESTER 2020-2021

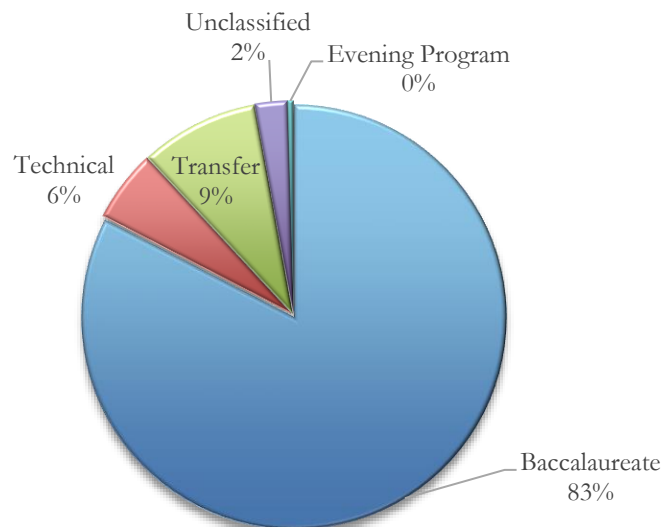

FULL TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENT AND TOTAL ENROLLMENT

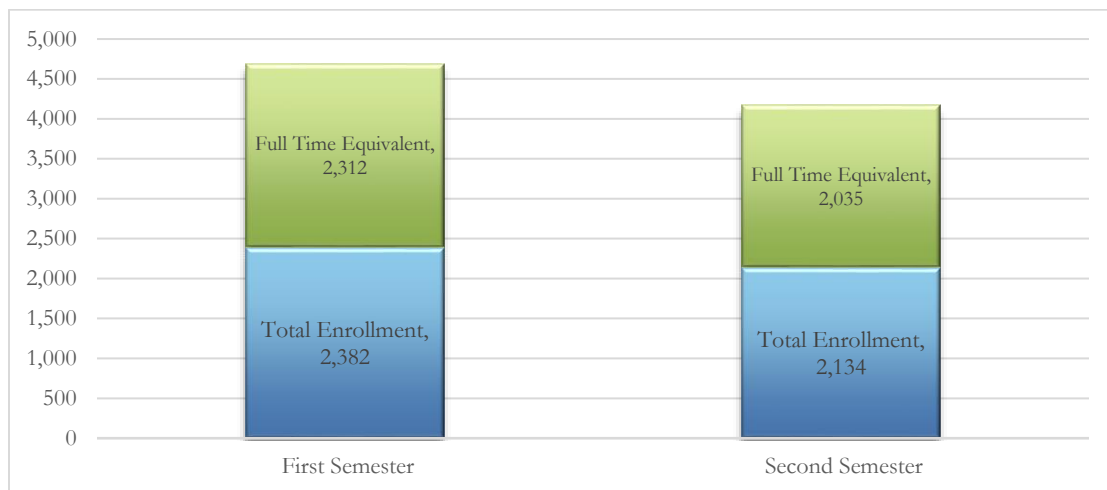

DISTRIBUTION OF FULL TIME AND PART TIME ENROLLMENT

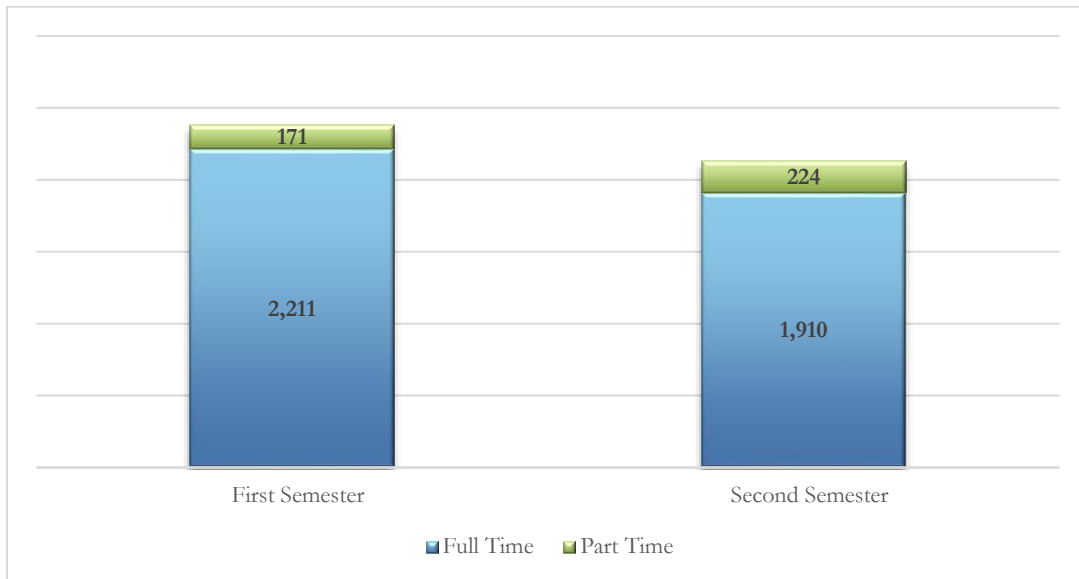

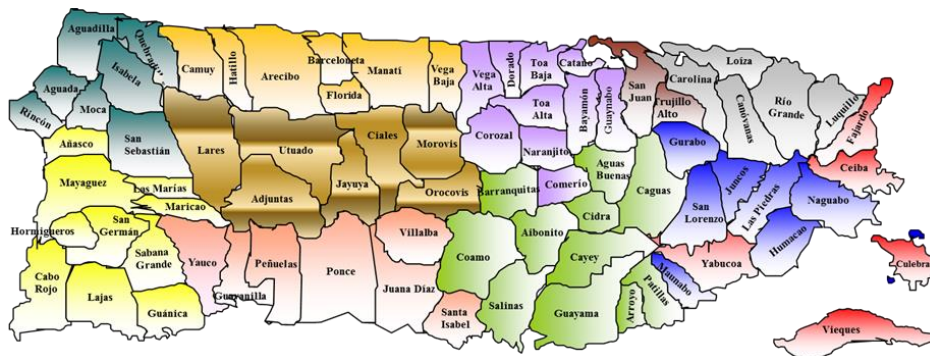

ACADEMIC YEARS 2016-2017 TO 2020-2021**

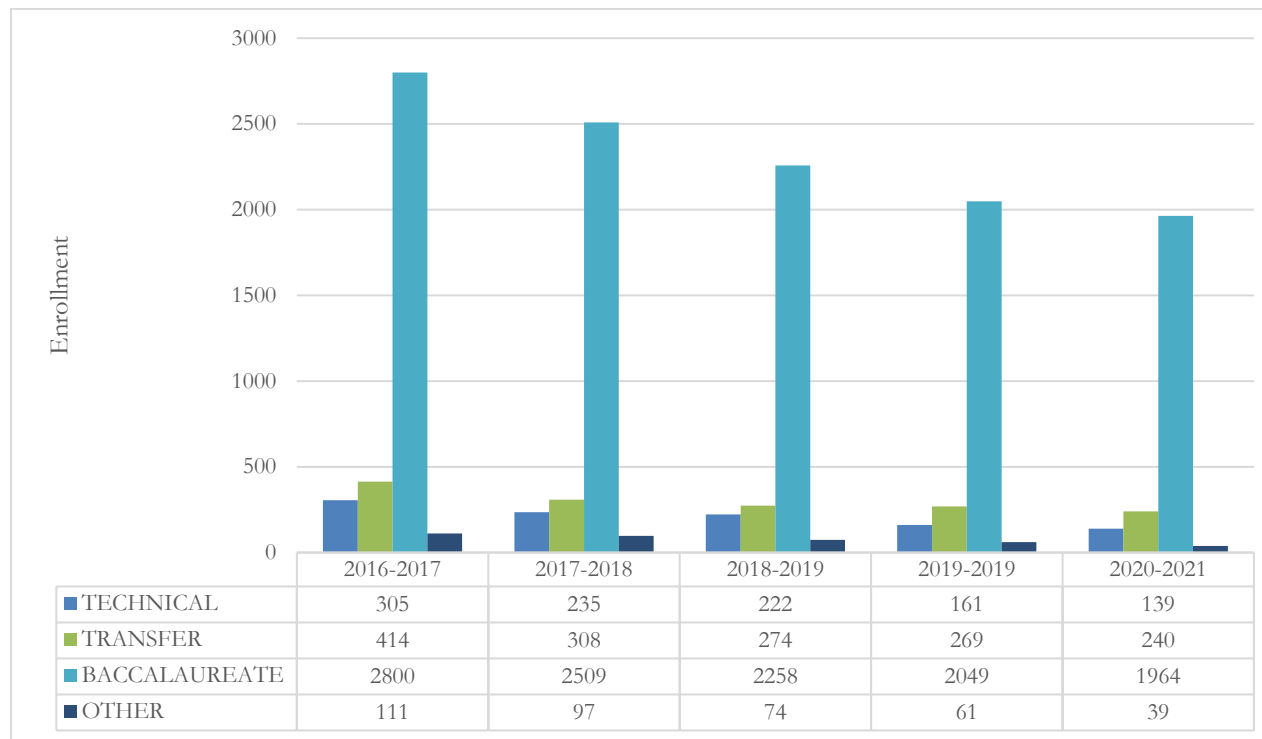

ACADEMIC YEARS 2016-2017 TO 2020-2021

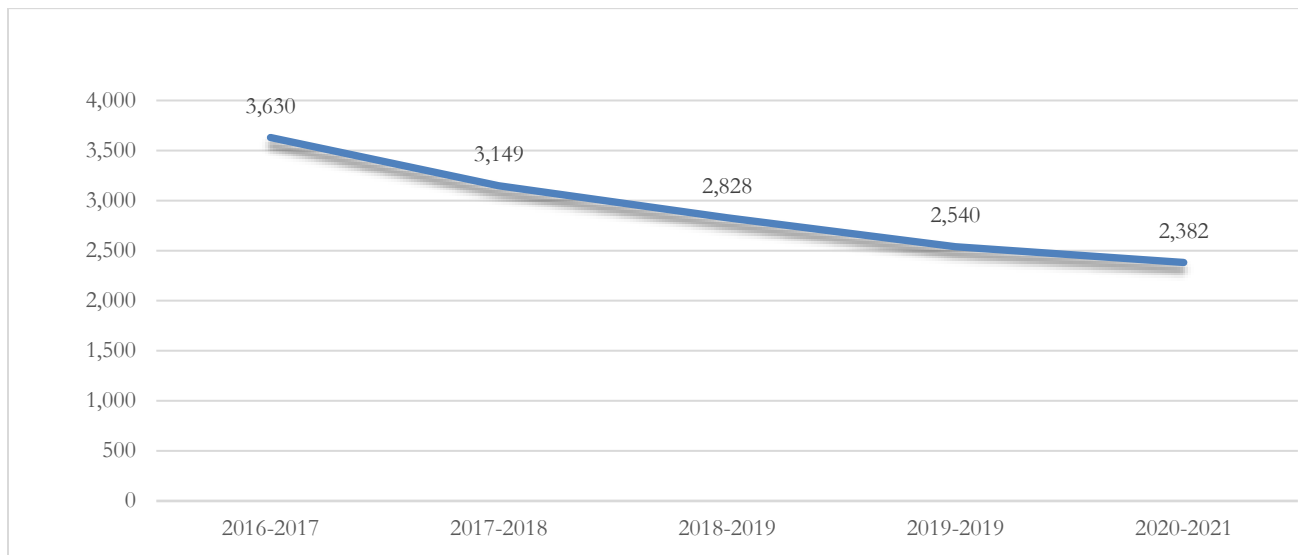

ACADEMIC YEAR 2016-2017 TO 2020-2021

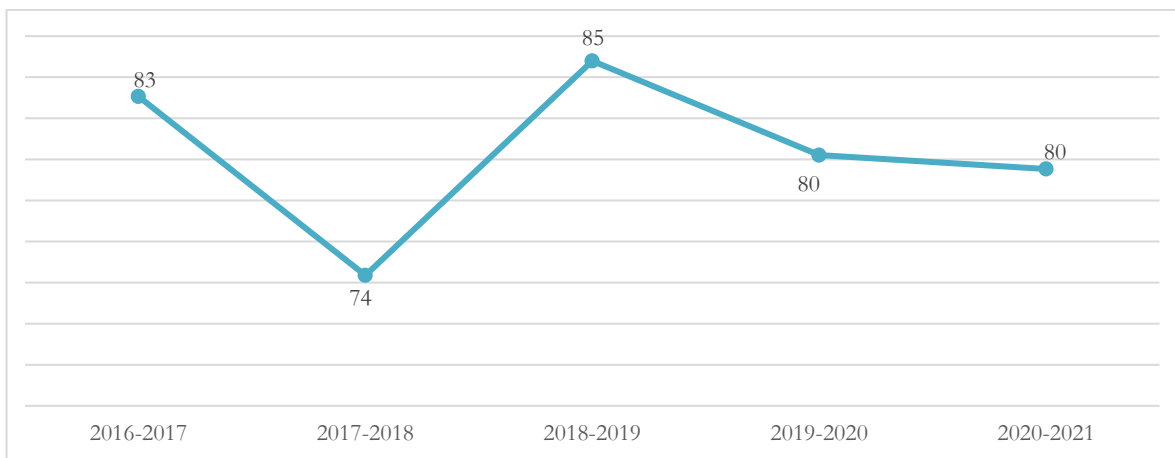

INCOMING STUDENTS PER SEMESTER

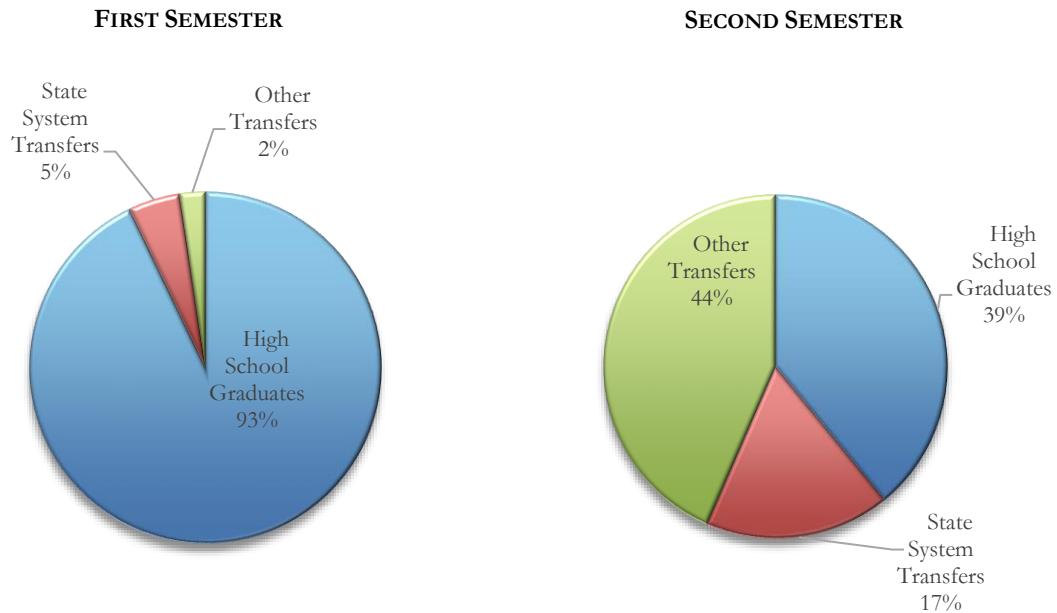

DISTRIBUTION OF INCOMING STUDENTS BY HIGH SCHOOL AVERAGE

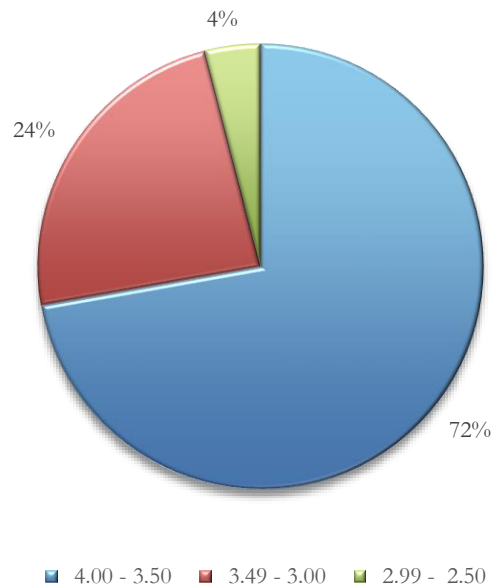

DISTRIBUTION OF INCOMING STUDENTS BY TYPE OF SCHOOL

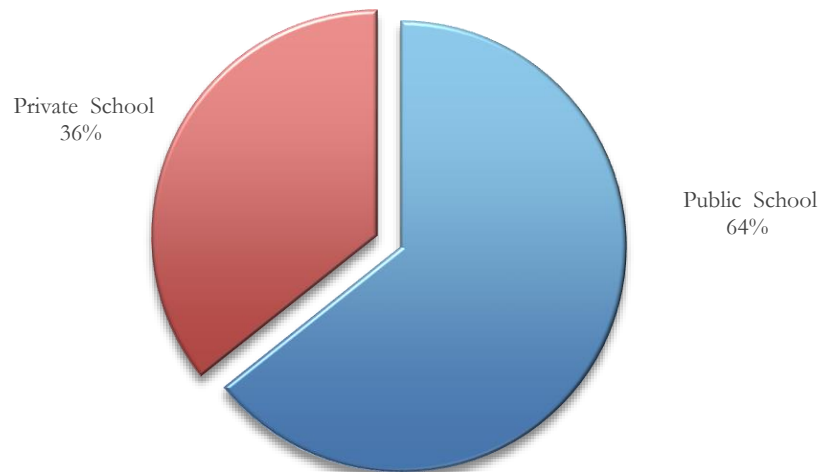

TRANSFER STUDENTS FROM PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS

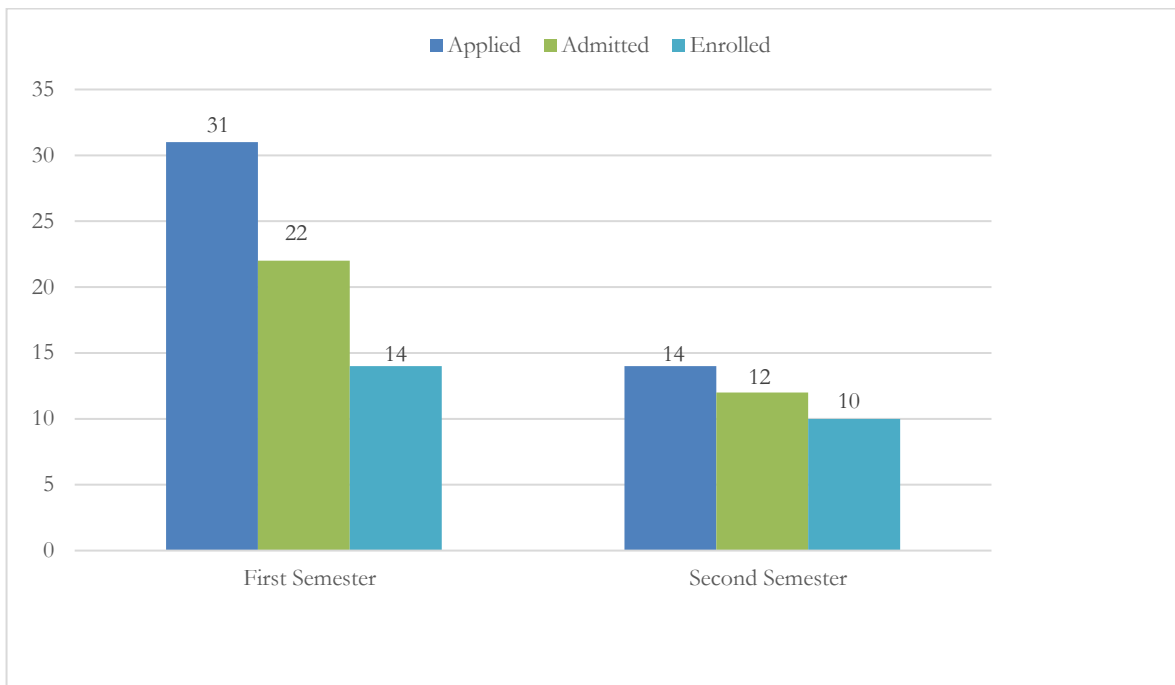

ADMISSION AND ENROLLMENT OF FRESHMEN STUDENTS

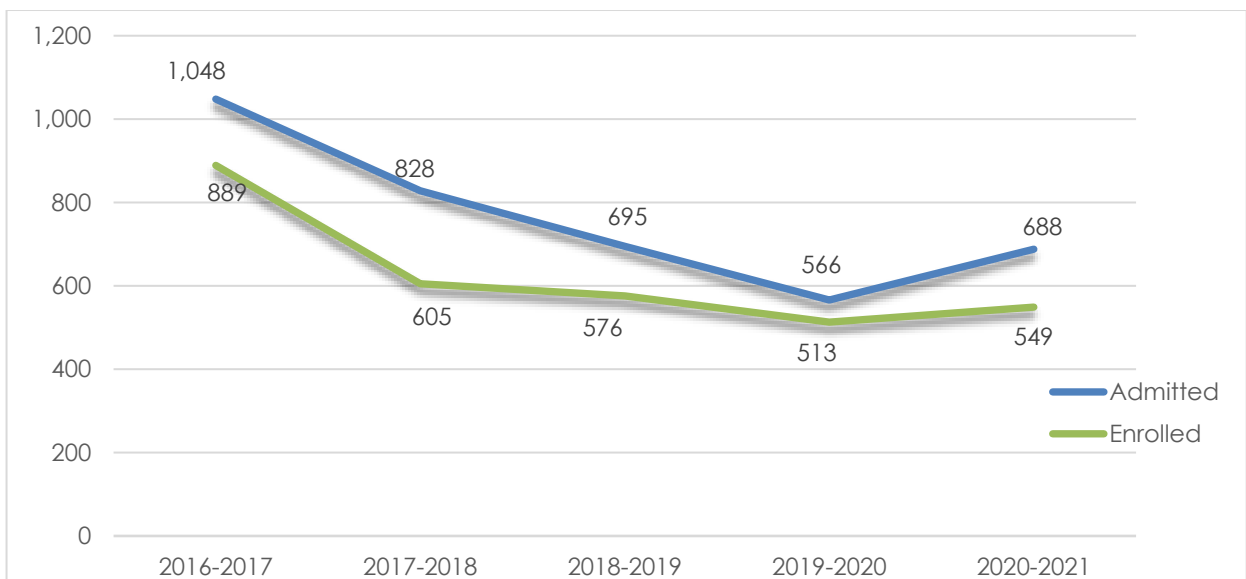

DEGREE CONFERRED BY PROGRAM

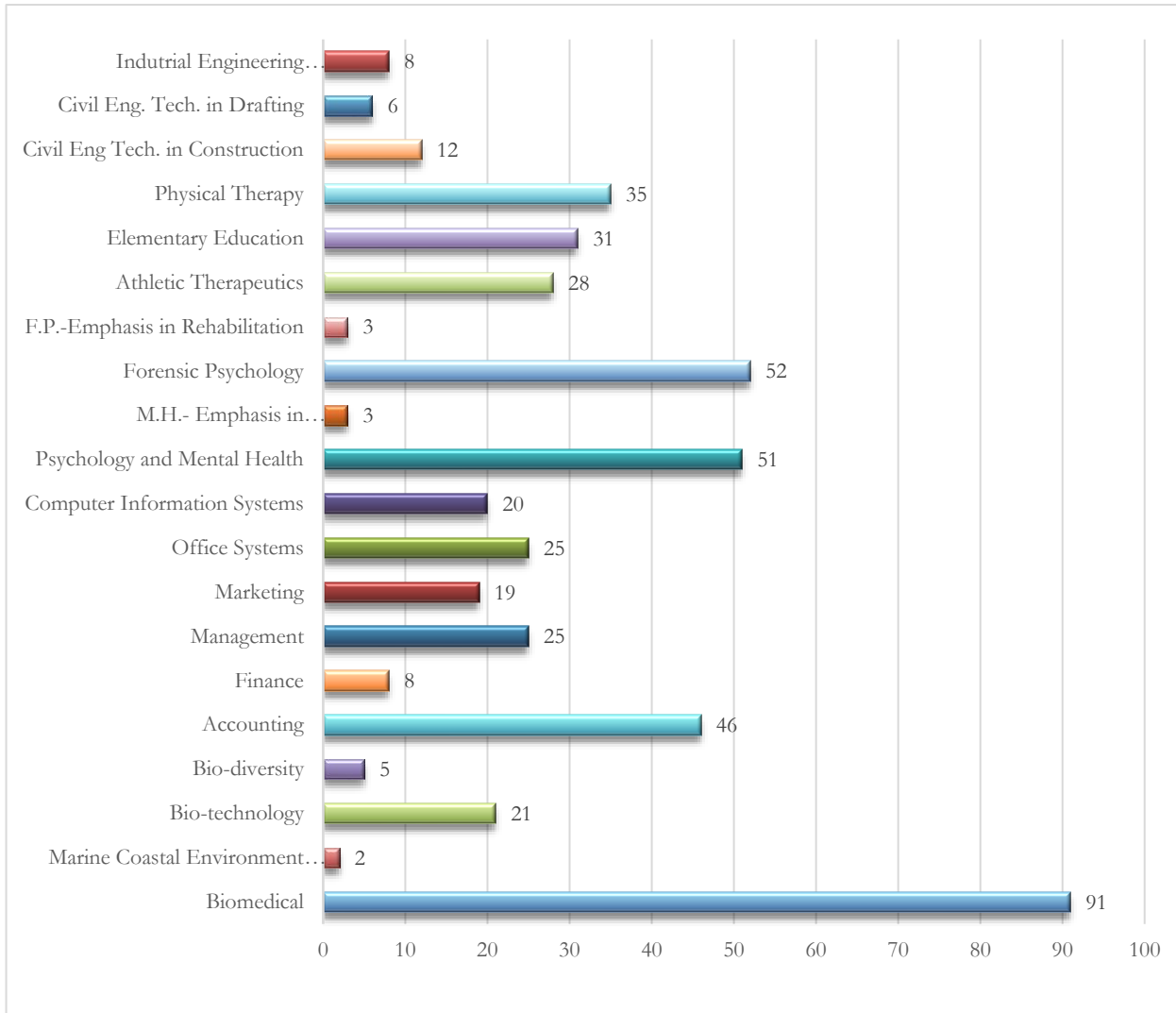

DISTRIBUTION OF DEGREE GRANTED

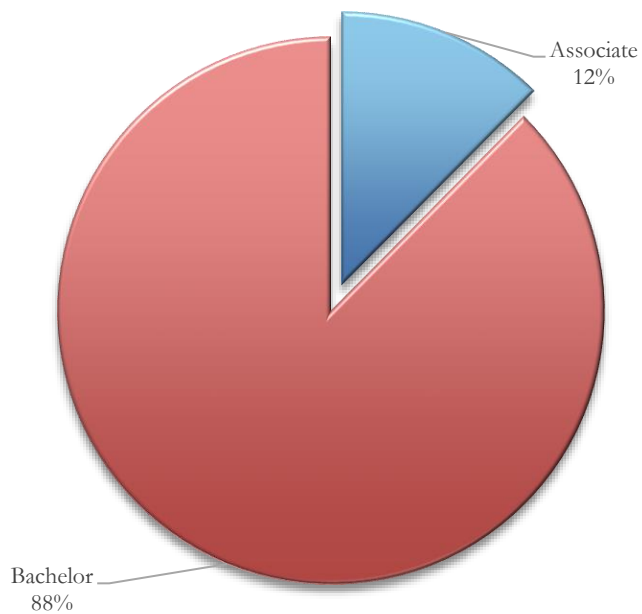

DISTRIBUTION OF DEGREE CONFERRED BY TYPE OF DEGREE

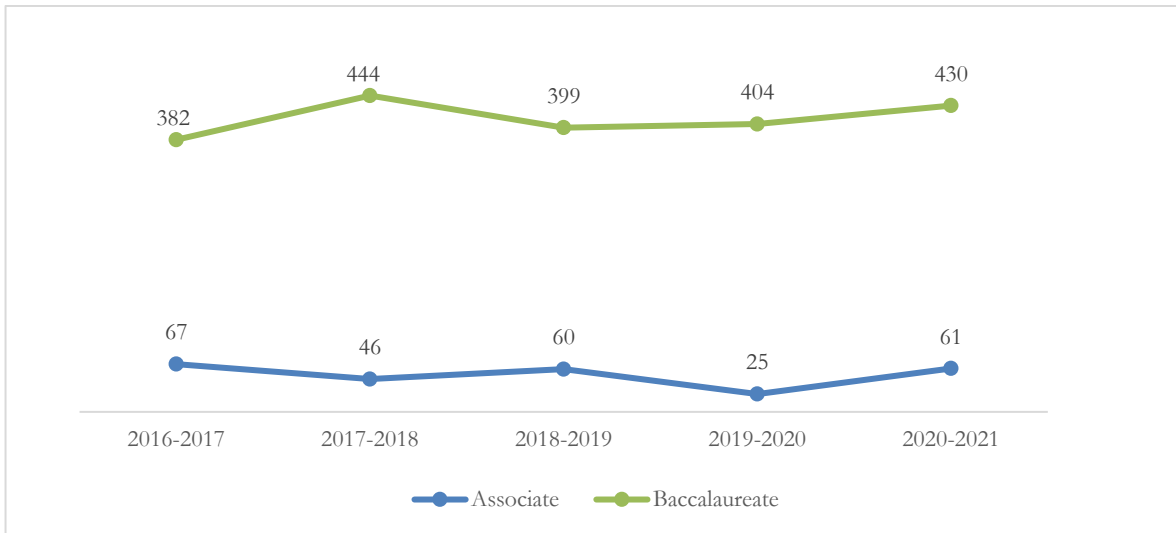

GRADUATION RATE DIAGRAM

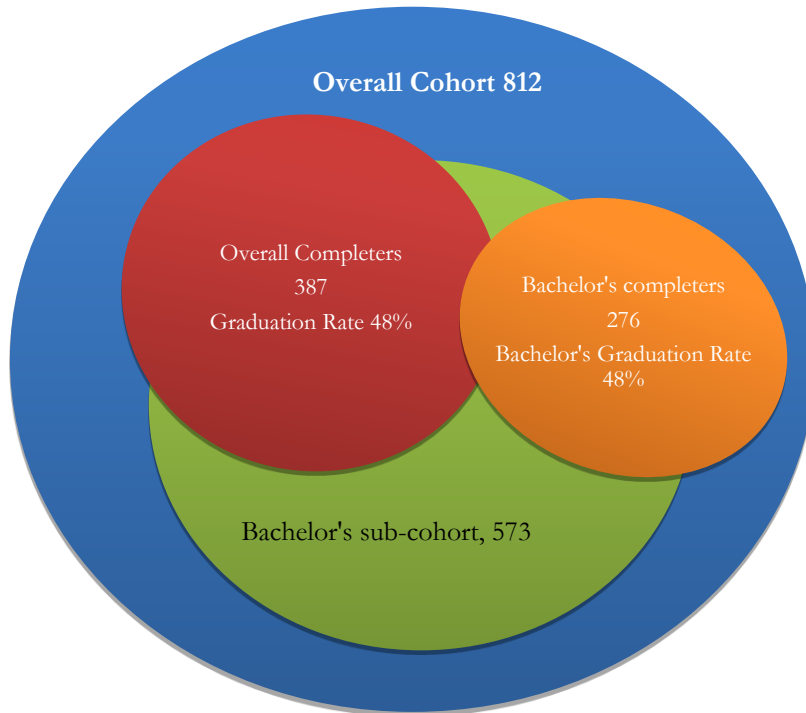

ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-2021

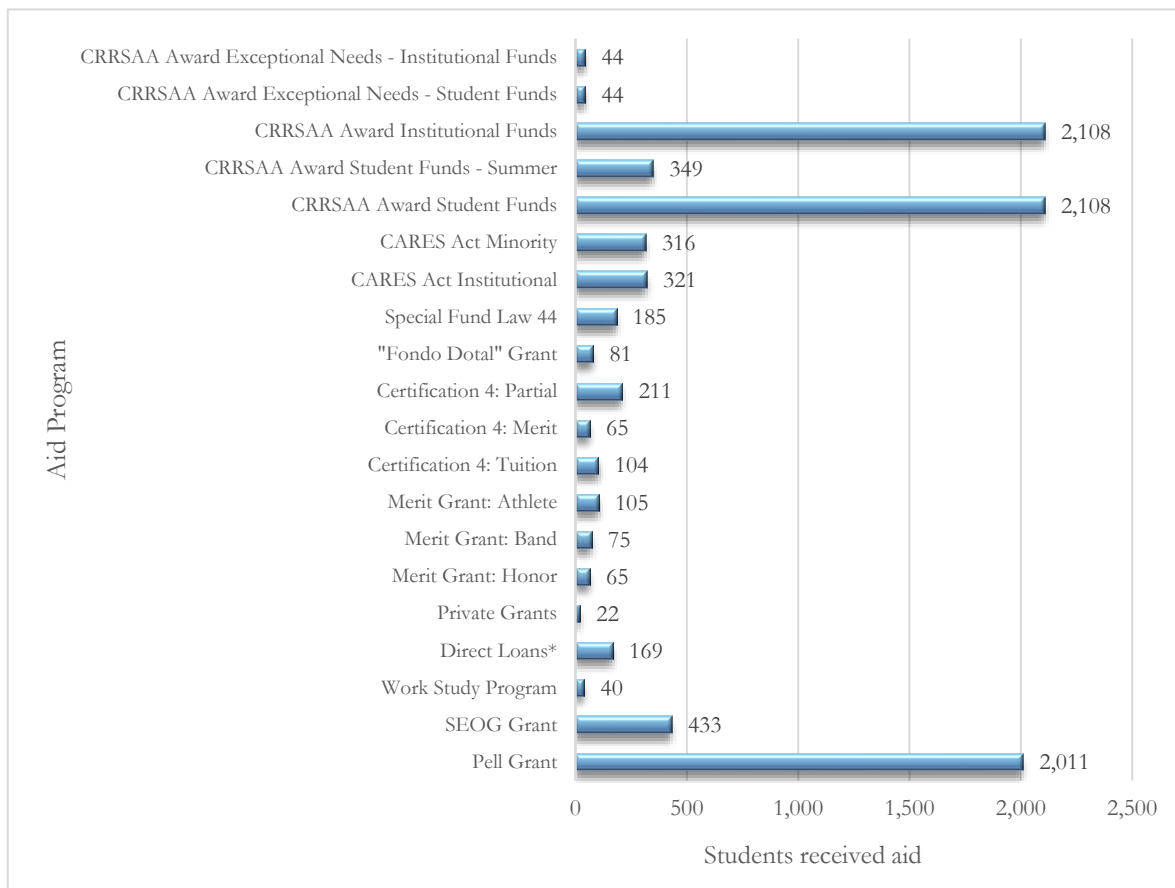

DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONNEL BY TYPE OF APPOINTMENT

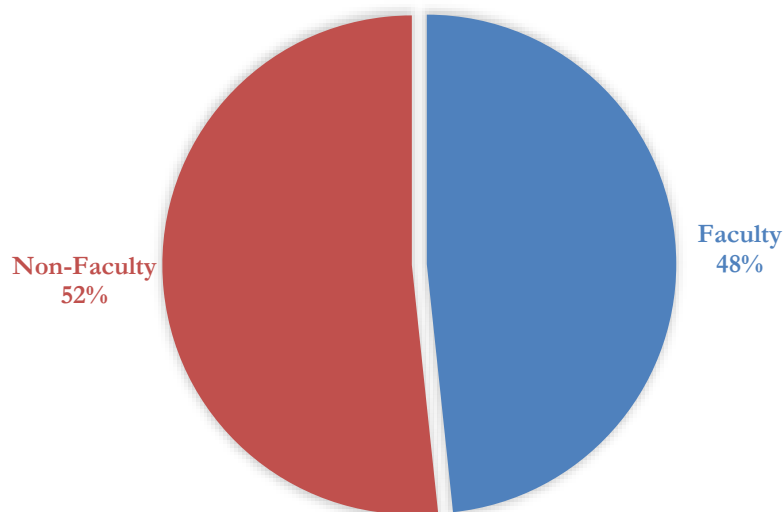

DISTRIBUTION OF FULL TIME AND PART TIME FACULTY

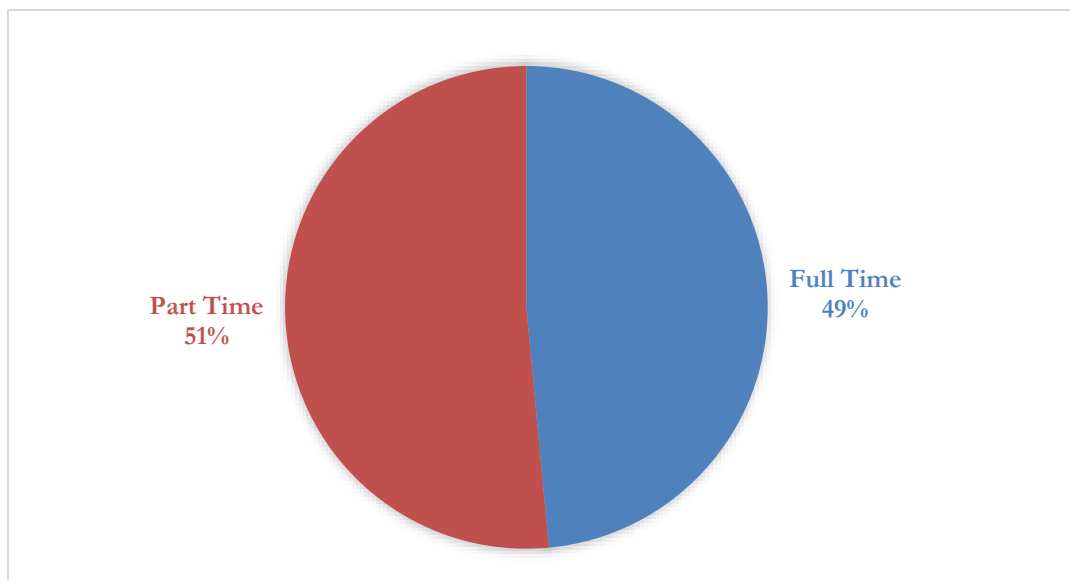

DISTRIBUTION OF FACULTY BY TYPE OF CONTRACT AND ACADEMIC DEGREE

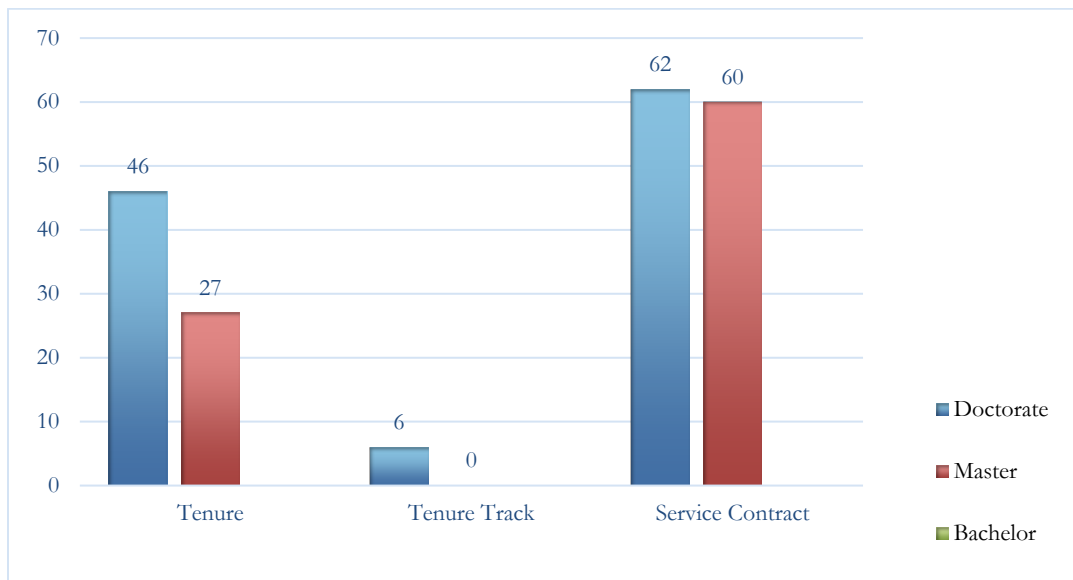

DISTRIBUTION OF FACULTY BY RANK AND ACADEMIC DEGREE

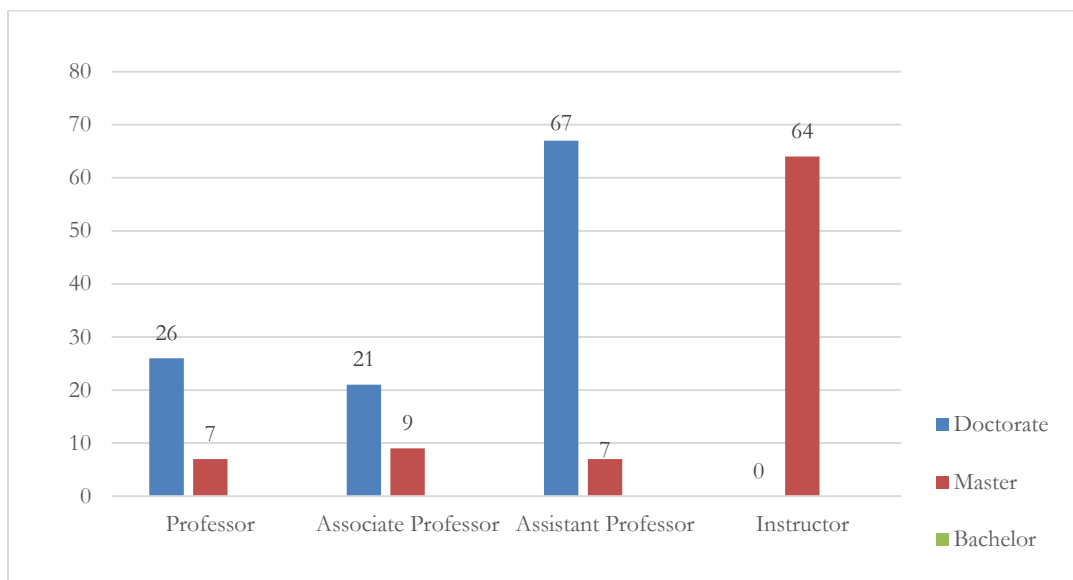

DISTRIBUTION OF LIBRARY EXPENDITURES

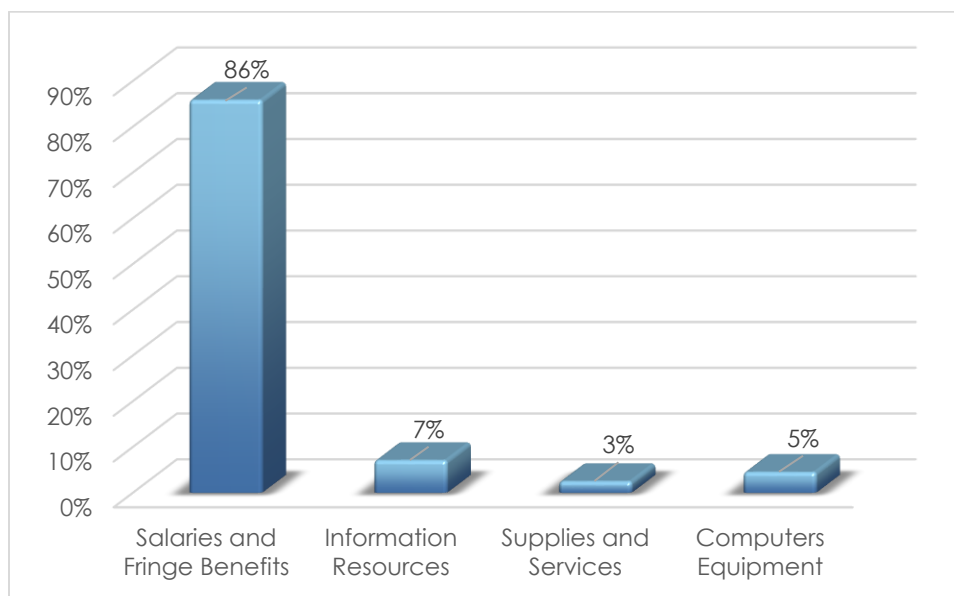

FISCAL YEARS 2020-2023 AS OF JUNE 30, 2020

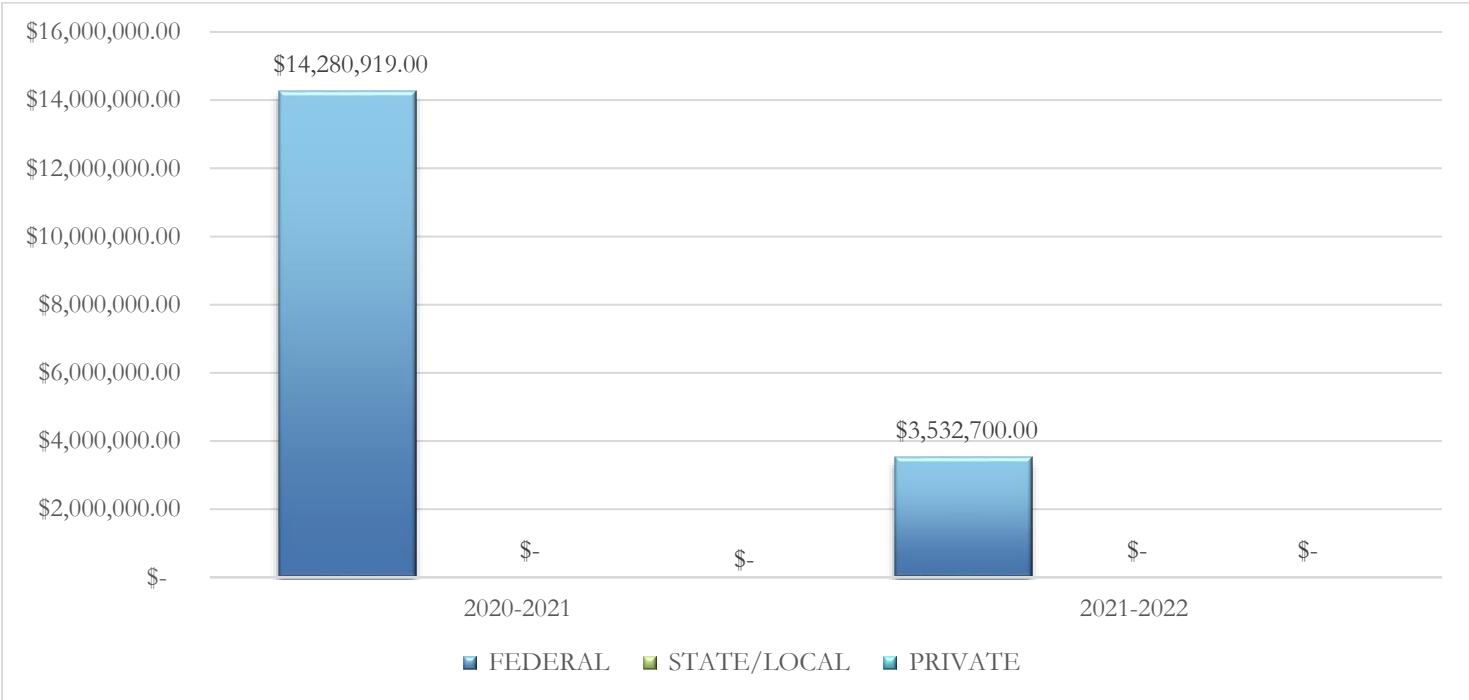
