UNIVERSITY OF PUERTO RICO IN PONCE

The UPR-Ponce is part of the UPR system and is the only public institution of higher education in the southern part of the island. Established as Ponce Regional College in 1969 and accredited by the Middle States Association since 1970, originally authorized to offer associate degrees and transfer programs, but added several baccalaureate degree programs beginning in the 1980's. It is in the city of Ponce in the southern coast of Puerto Rico, approximately 67 miles from the capital city of San Juan.

The **Middle States Commission on Higher Education** (MSCHE) has accredited the UPR-Ponce since 1970; and reaffirmed accreditation in 2019. The next self-study evaluation will be in 2024-2025. The UPR-Ponce has the following professional accreditations for the academic programs: Accreditation of the Business Administration Program and Office Systems Program by the **Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs** (ACBSP); accreditation of the Computerized Information Systems Program by the **Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology** (ABET); and the accreditation of the Elementary Education Program by the **Council for the Accreditation of Educators Program** (CAEP). In addition, the **Association of College, and Research Libraries** (ACRL) favorably recognized the Adelina Coppin Library, while the **International Association of Counseling Services** (IACS) re-accredited the Counseling and Psychological Services Office.

At present, the institution offers twelve bachelor's degrees, four associate degrees, and forty-four articulated transfer programs to other UPR campuses. Total headcount enrollment for fall 2022-2023 was 2,221, approximately sixteen percent (16%) less than the average 2,632 for the previous five-year period. Ninety-one percent (91%) of the student population studies full time, 98.4% receives some form of financial aid, and 55% is female. Seventy-seven percent (77%) of the student body belongs to bachelor's degree programs, 7% to technical programs, and 12% to transfer programs. The remainder 4% was classified in other categories.

Approximately 187 faculty and 212 non-faculty staff members serve the student body. On average, the student/faculty ratio is 18:1. The 2022-2023 faculty profile revealed that 57%

of faculty teaches full-time. Fifty-eight per cent (58%) have doctoral degrees. Eighteen per cent (18%) of faculty holds the rank of professor, 12% associate professor, 39% assistant professor, and 32% instructor. UPR-Ponce has an operational budget of \$20,849,660 for the academic year 2022-2023.

OUTSTANDING FACTS

This section gathers the most outstanding facts for this year's edition of the UPR-Ponce Annual Institutional Data Profile. This information covers academic, student, and administrative areas of the Institution for the academic year 2022-2023. Among the most outstanding facts that emerge from this statistical information are the following, analyzed for the first semester of the academic year 2022-2023.

-  UPR-Ponce total headcount enrollment was 2,221; as compared to last year's enrollment, it evidences a decrease of two percent (2%).
-  Seventy-seven percent (77%) of 2022-2023 total headcount enrollment belongs to Baccalaureate degree programs, while 7% belongs to Associate or Technical Degree and 12% to Transfer Programs of total headcount enrollment for the first semester.
-  Total headcount enrollment decreased by 10% for the second semester of this academic year.
-  The student retention rate was 77%. The past five-year average retention rate was 79%.
-  Athletic Therapeutics was the baccalaureate program with a higher retention rate, (85%).
-  The technical program with a higher retention rate (78%) was Physical Therapy.
-  The six-year overall graduation rate was 44%. Bachelor sub-cohort's graduation rate was 47%.
-  Ninety-four per cent (94%) of incoming freshmen entered with a high school index that fell between 3.00 and 4.00.
-  Sixty-one per cent (61%) of incoming freshmen came from the public-school system.
-  Of the baccalaureate degrees conferred (262) this year, the greatest number belonged to the Biomedical Sciences program, which constituted 18%.
-  Of all technical degrees conferred (29), the greatest number of degrees granted belongs to the Physical Therapy program with 45%.
-  Total degree conferred decreased by 23%, if compared to previous year.
-  Ninety-eight per cent (98%) of this academic year's total enrollment received some form of financial aid.




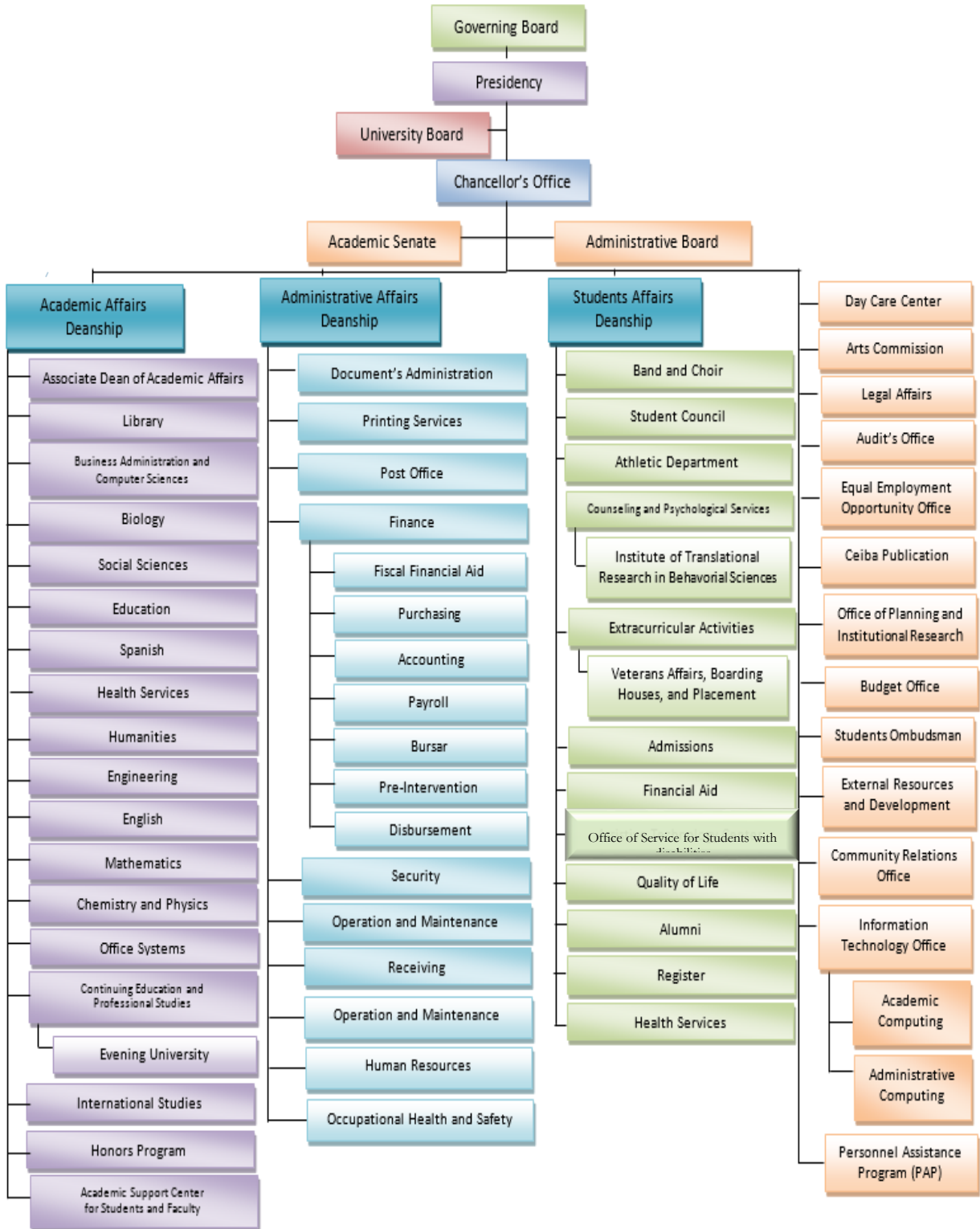
-  Fifty-seven per cent (57%) of the 2022-2023 UPR-Ponce faculty hold a doctorate degree, while 41% hold master's degree.
-  The faculty average teaching load for academic year 2022-2023 ranged from 12.09 to 16.61 credit hours.
-  UPR-Ponce's budget for 2022-2023 was \$20,849,660, evidencing an increase of 4.24% if compared to previous year budget.

Figure 2: Total Enrollment of Baccalaureate Programs

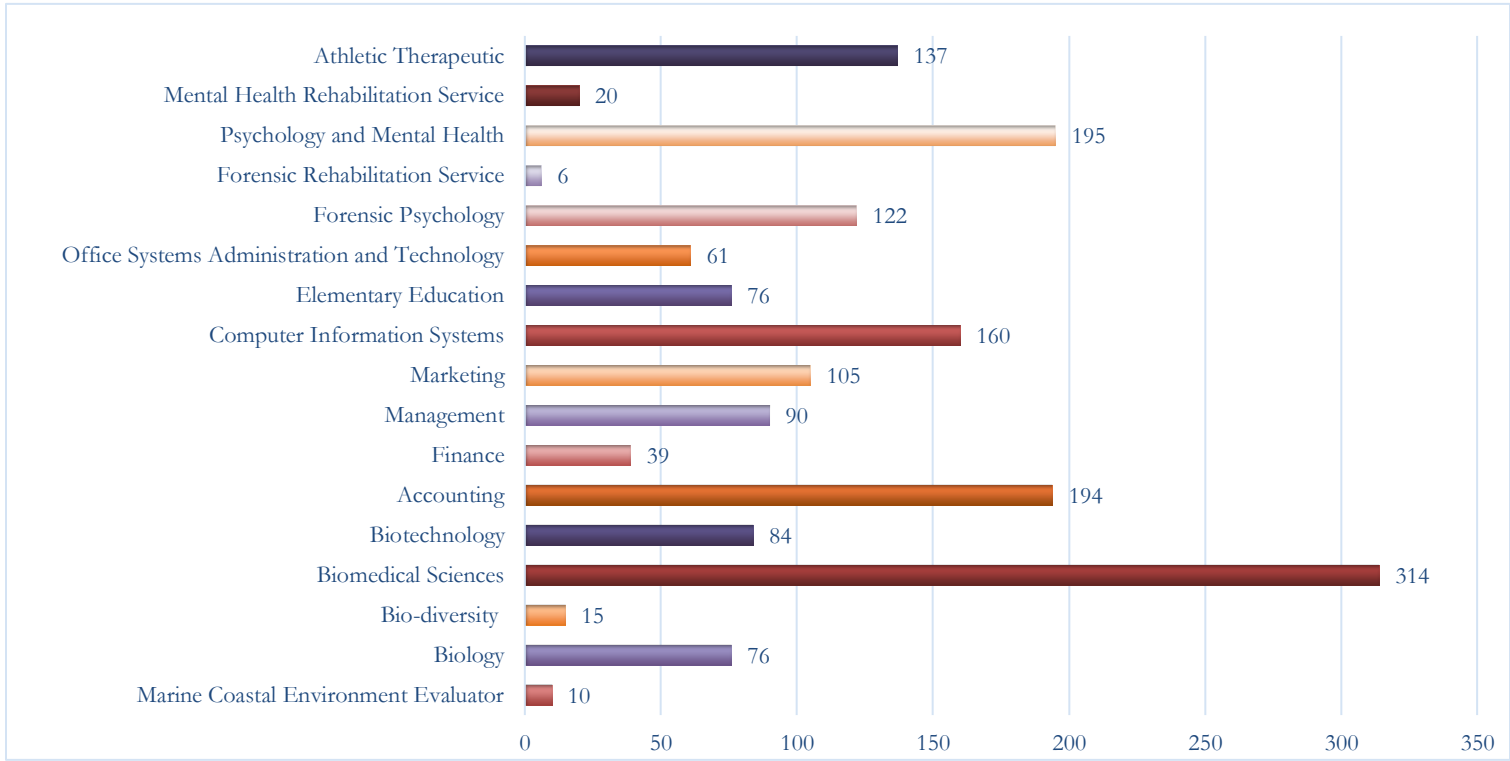


Figure 3: Total Enrollment of Technical Programs

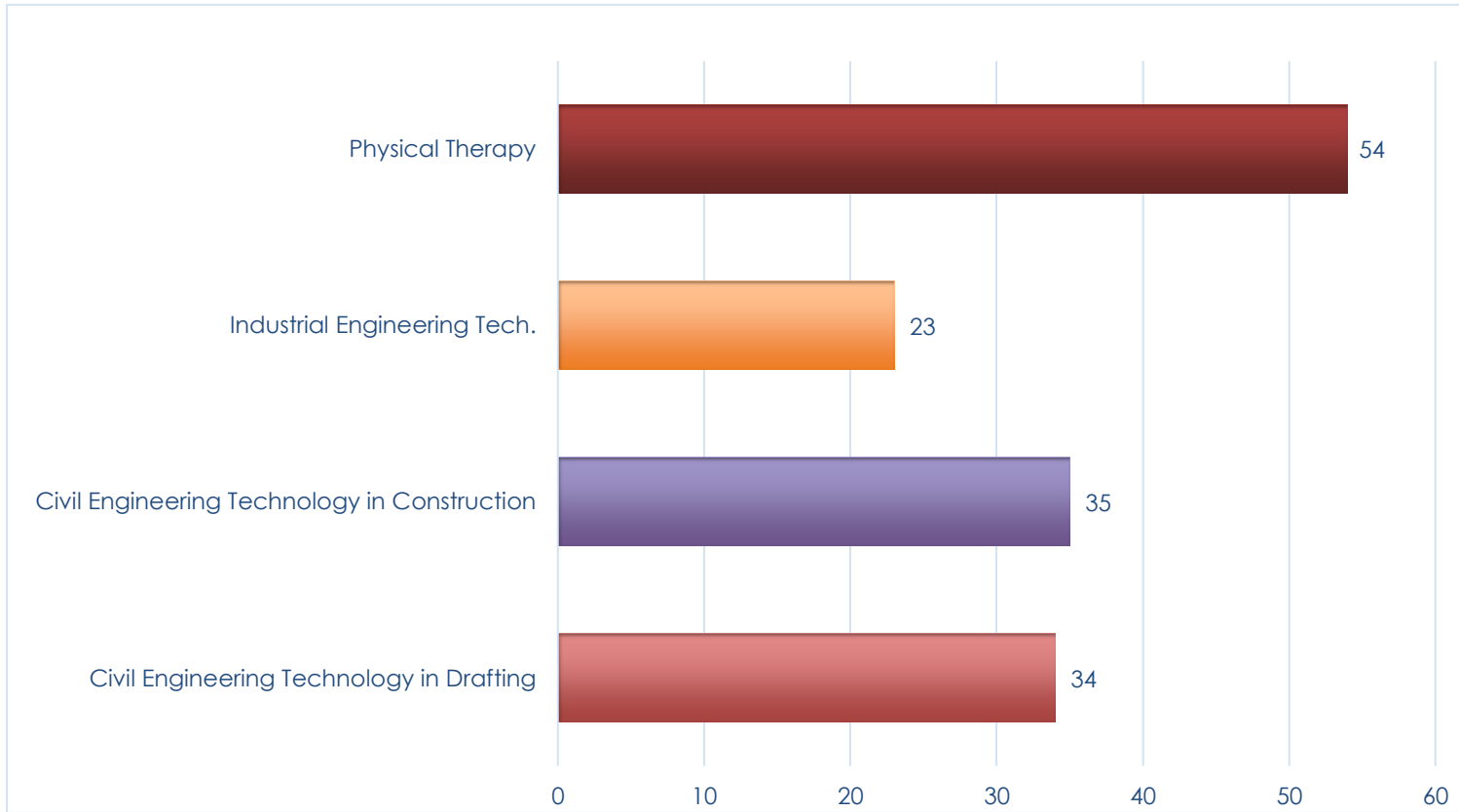
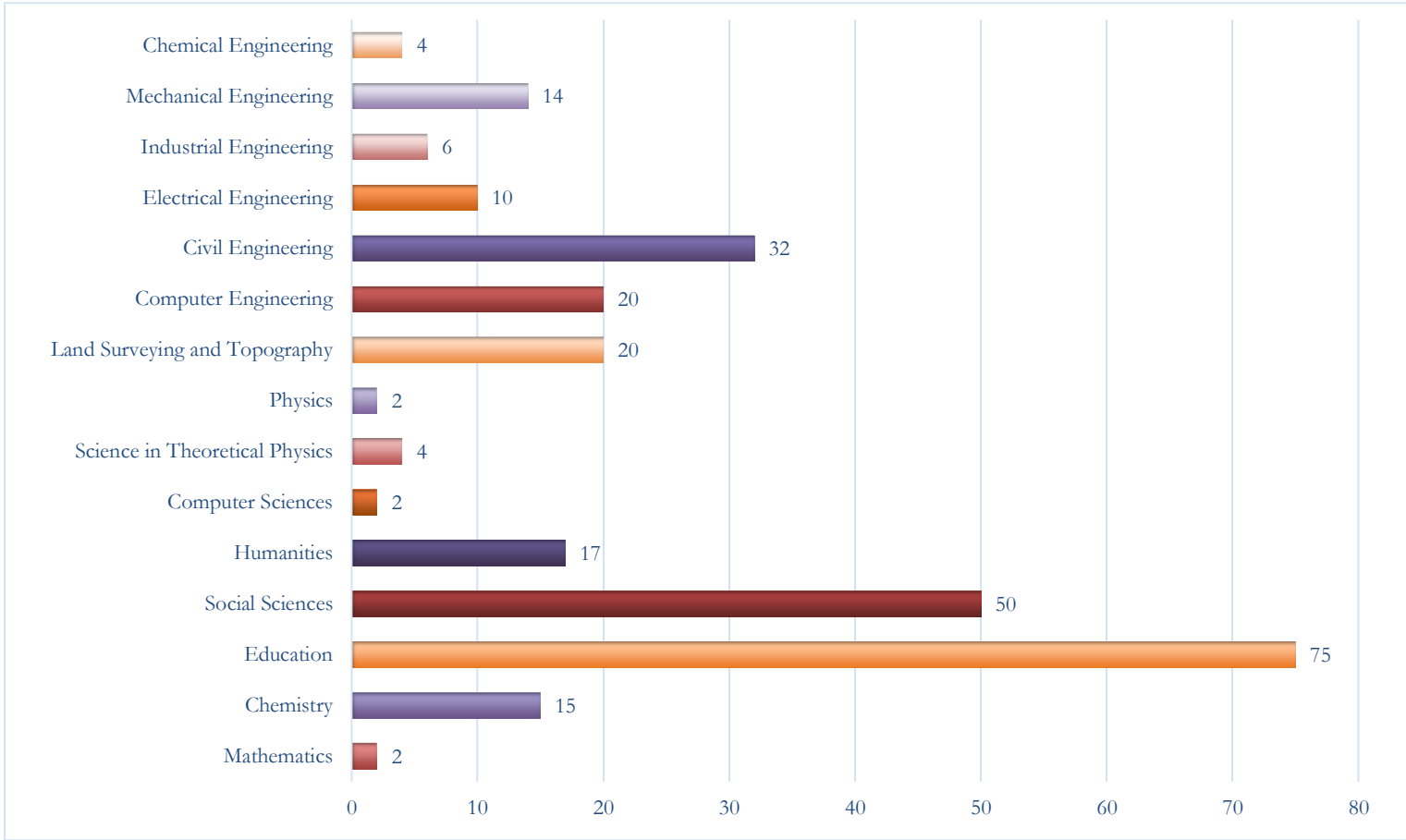


Figure 4: Total Enrollment of Transfer Programs

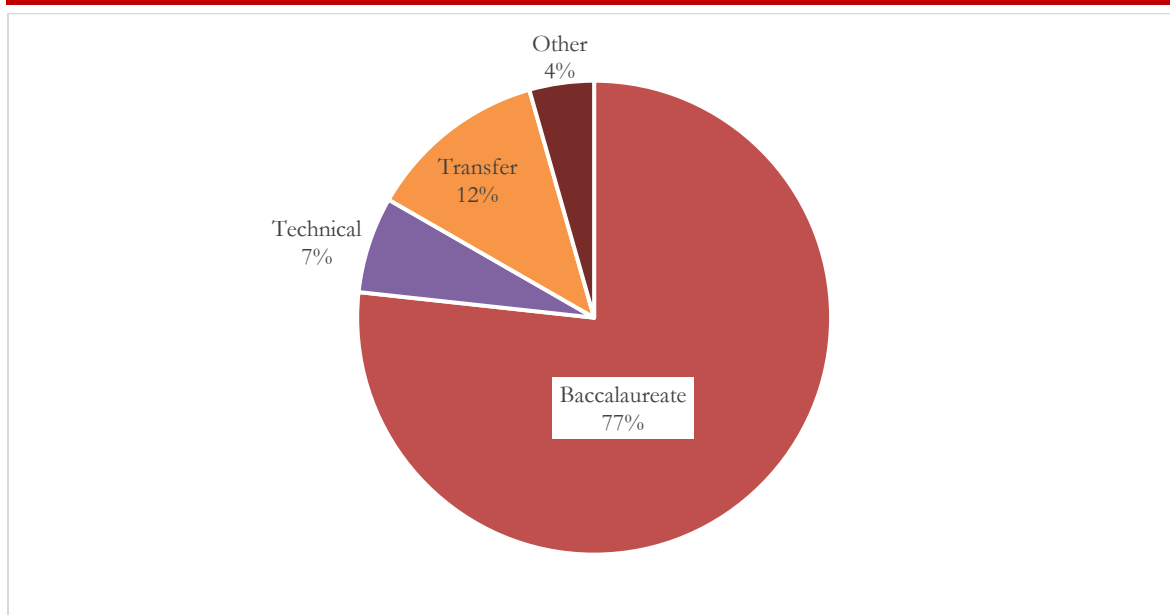

First Semester**

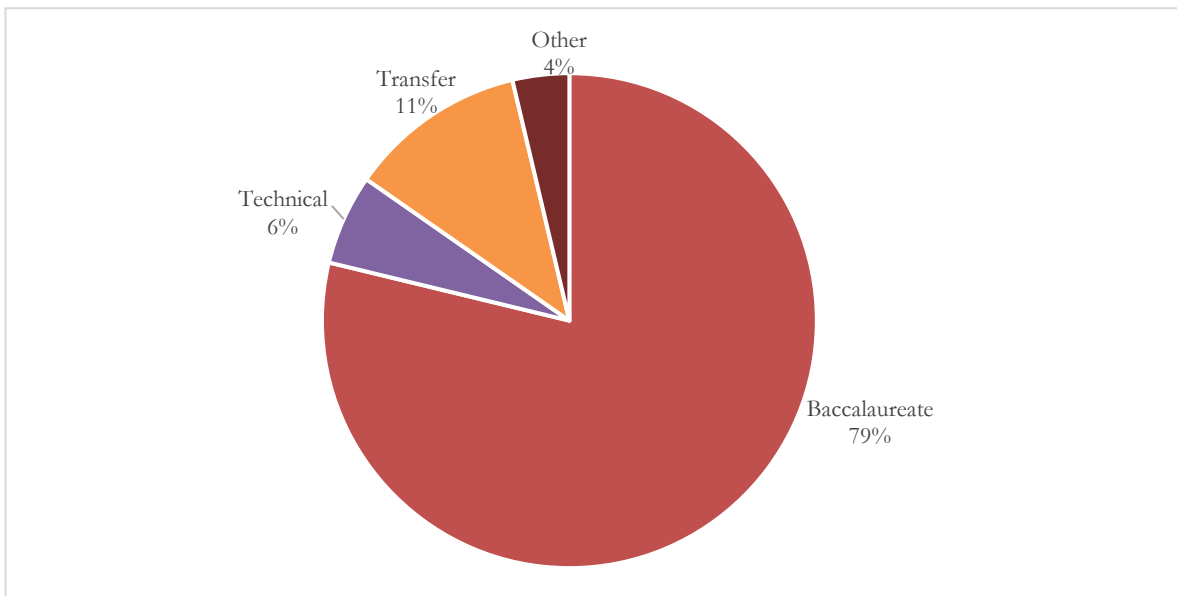

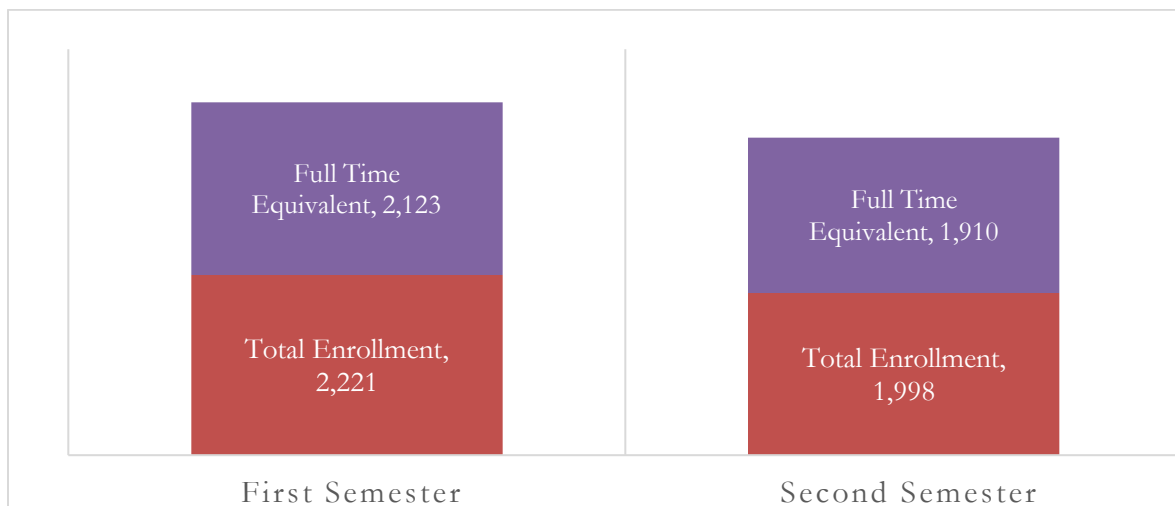

Figure 7: Full Time Equivalent Enrollment and Total Enrollment

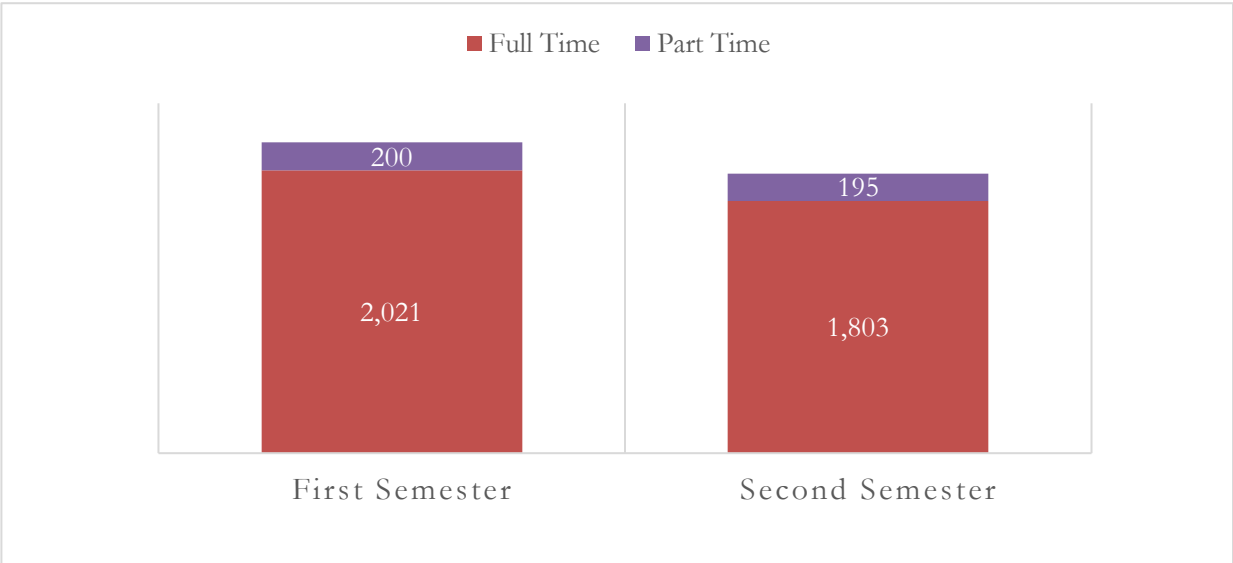

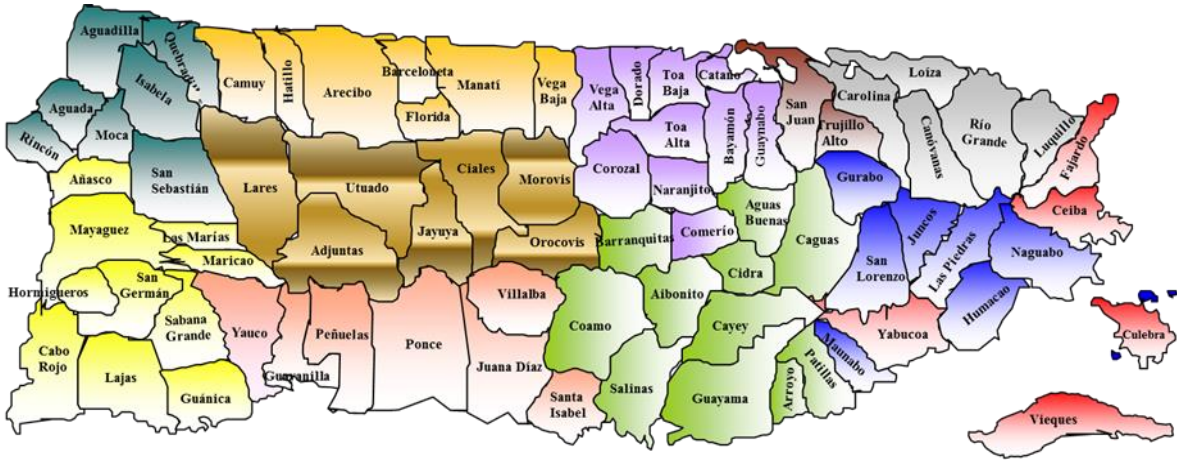

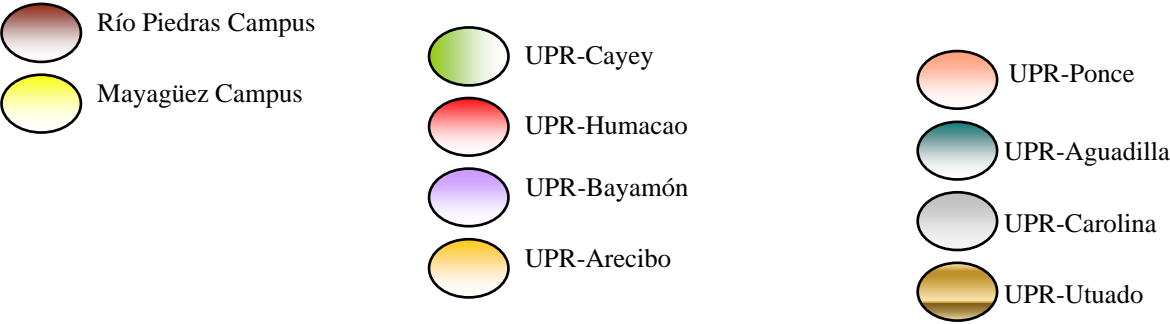

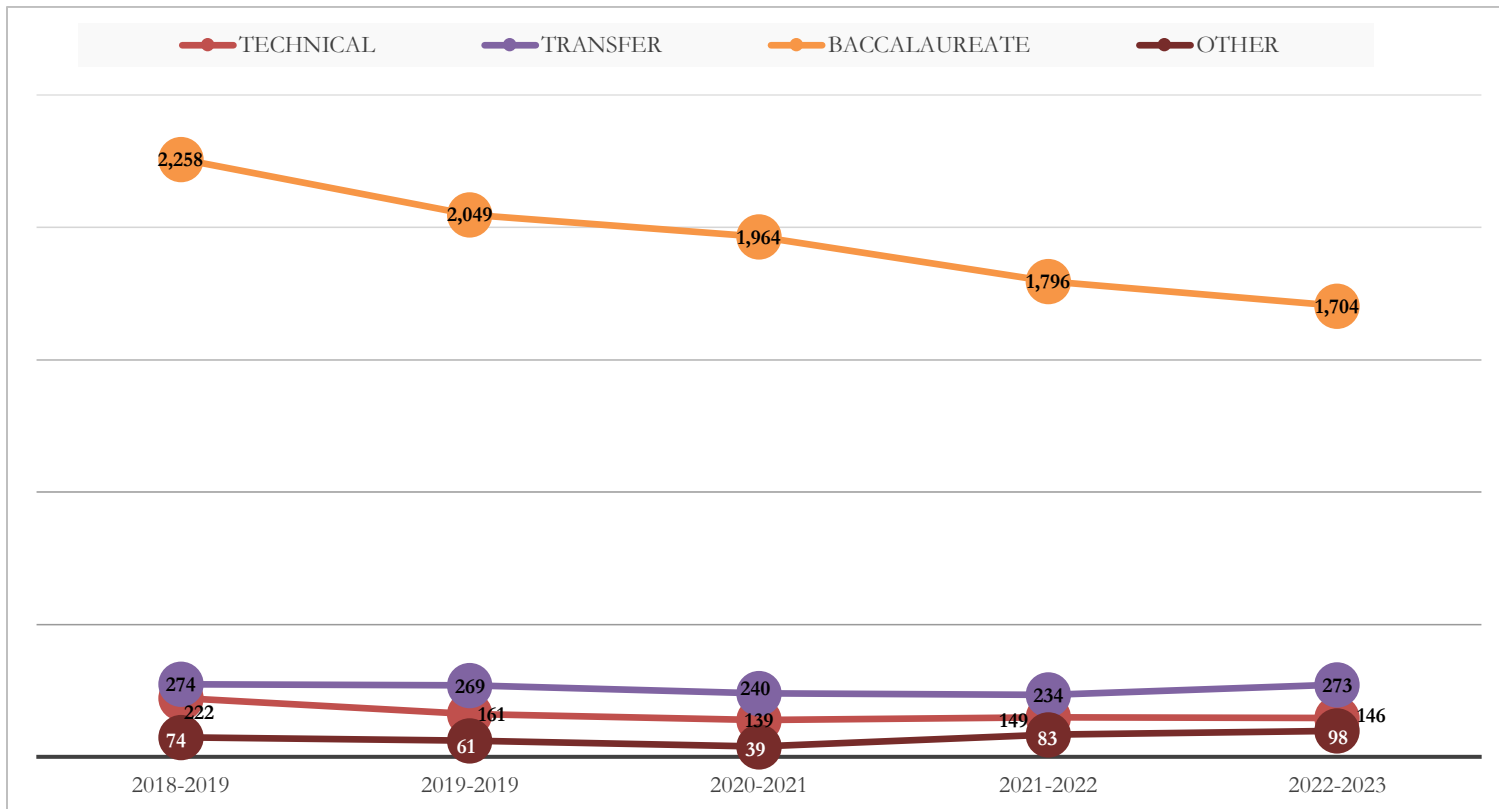

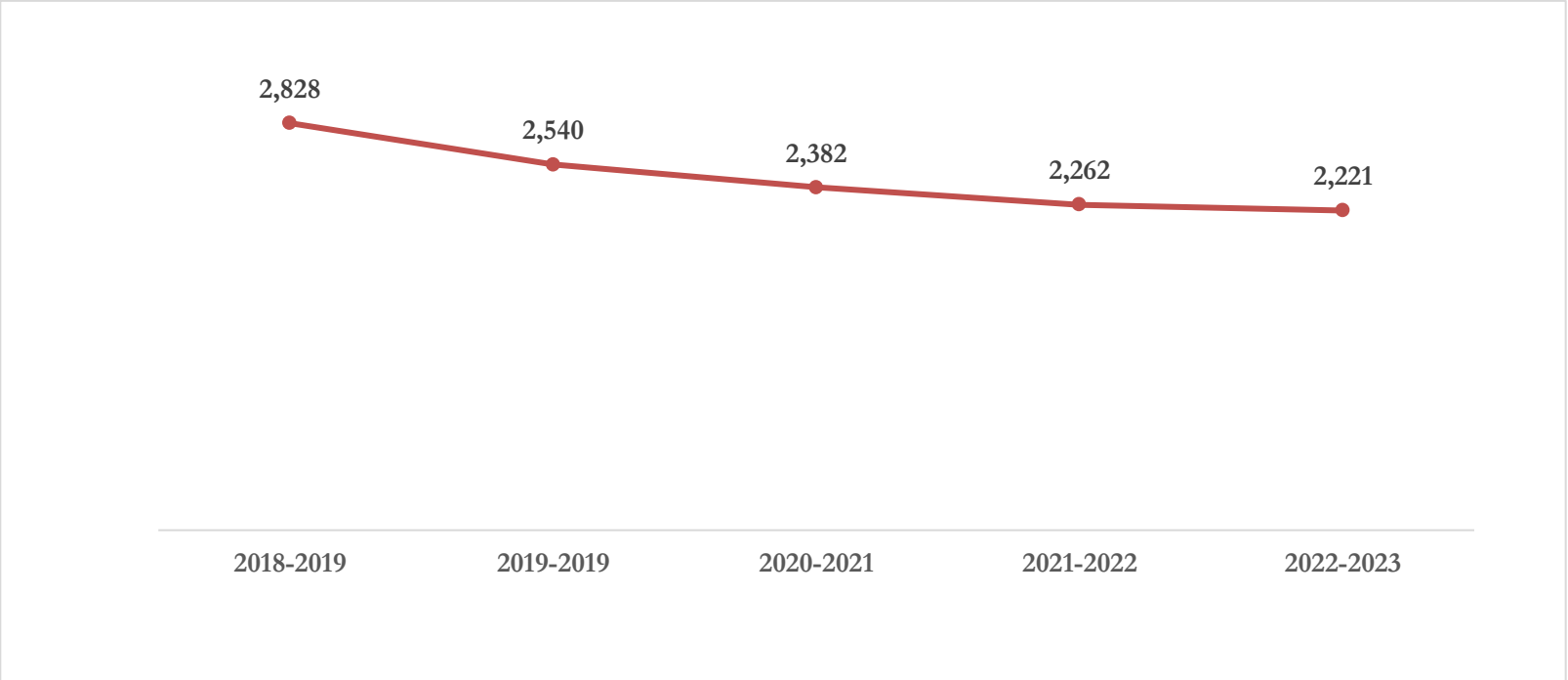

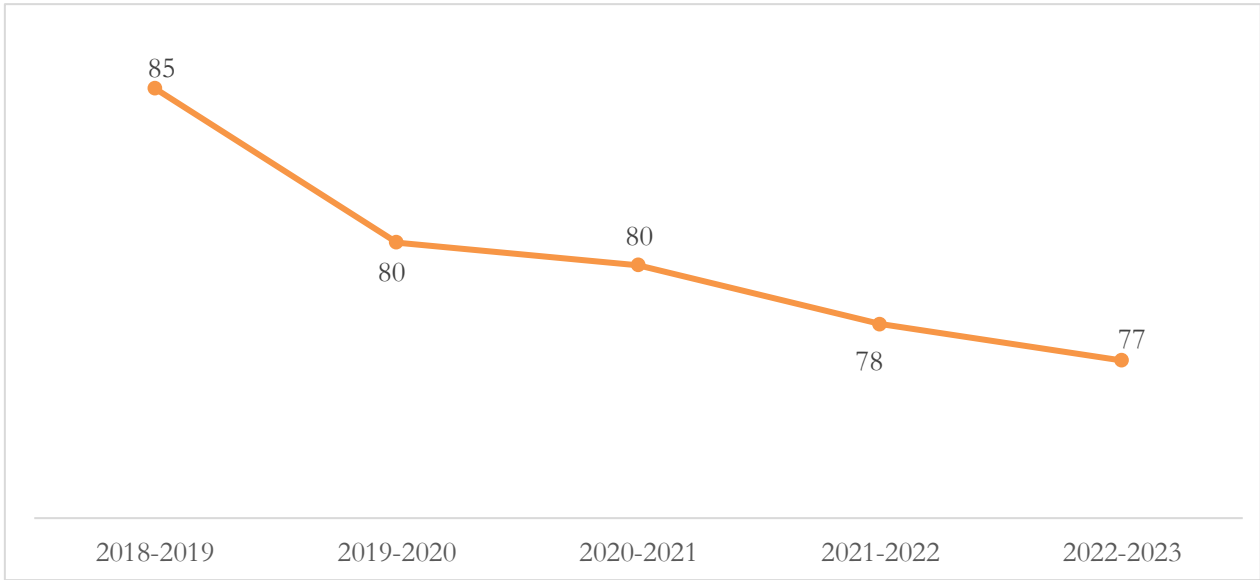

Figure 13: Incoming Students per Semester

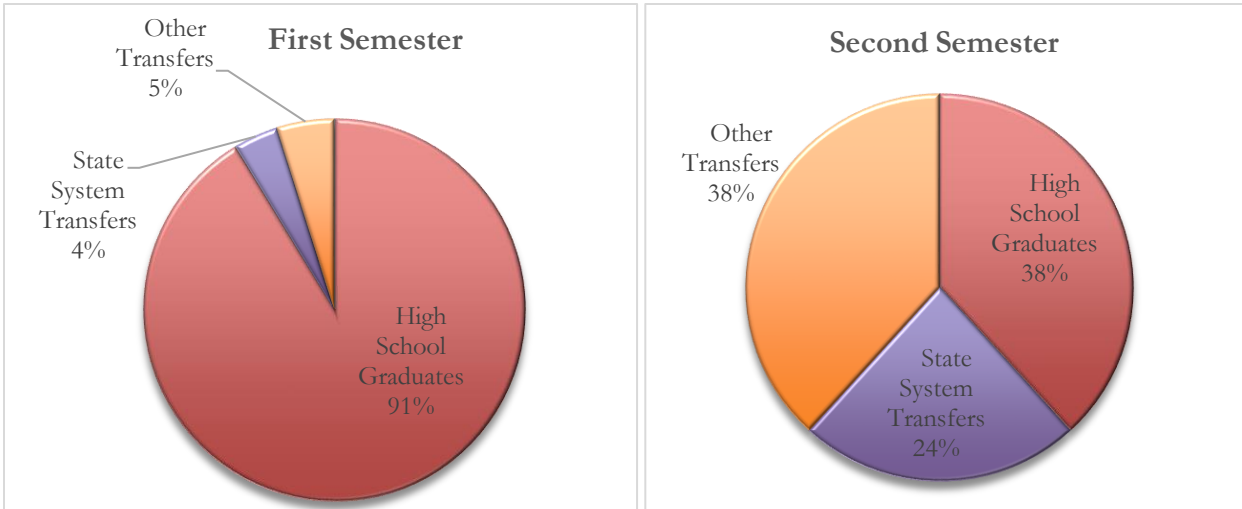

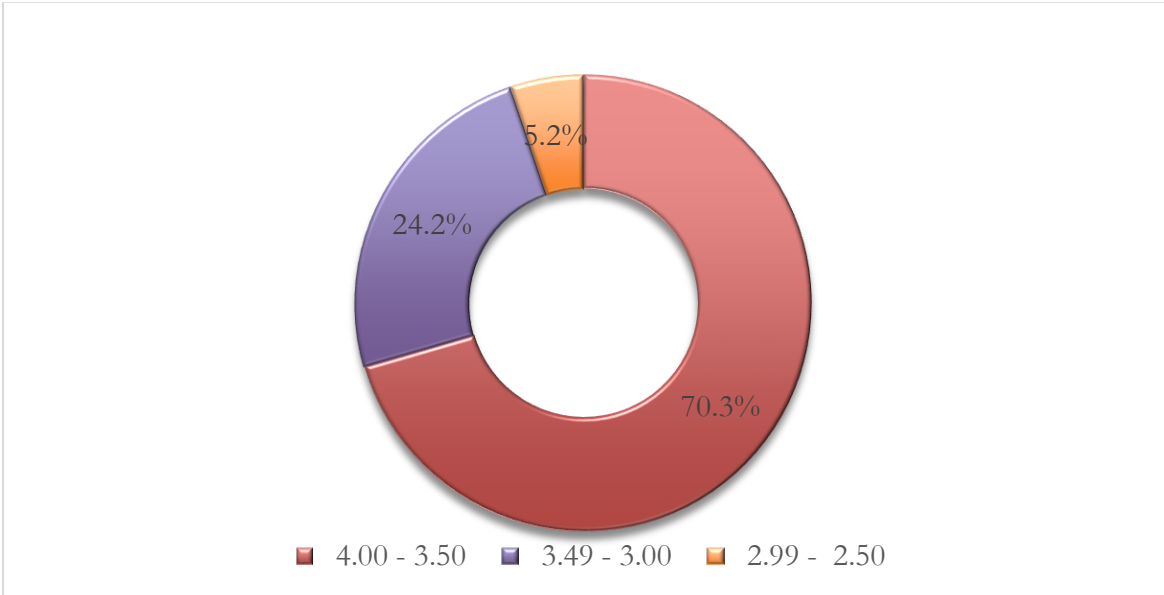

Figure 15: Distribution of Incoming Students by Type of School

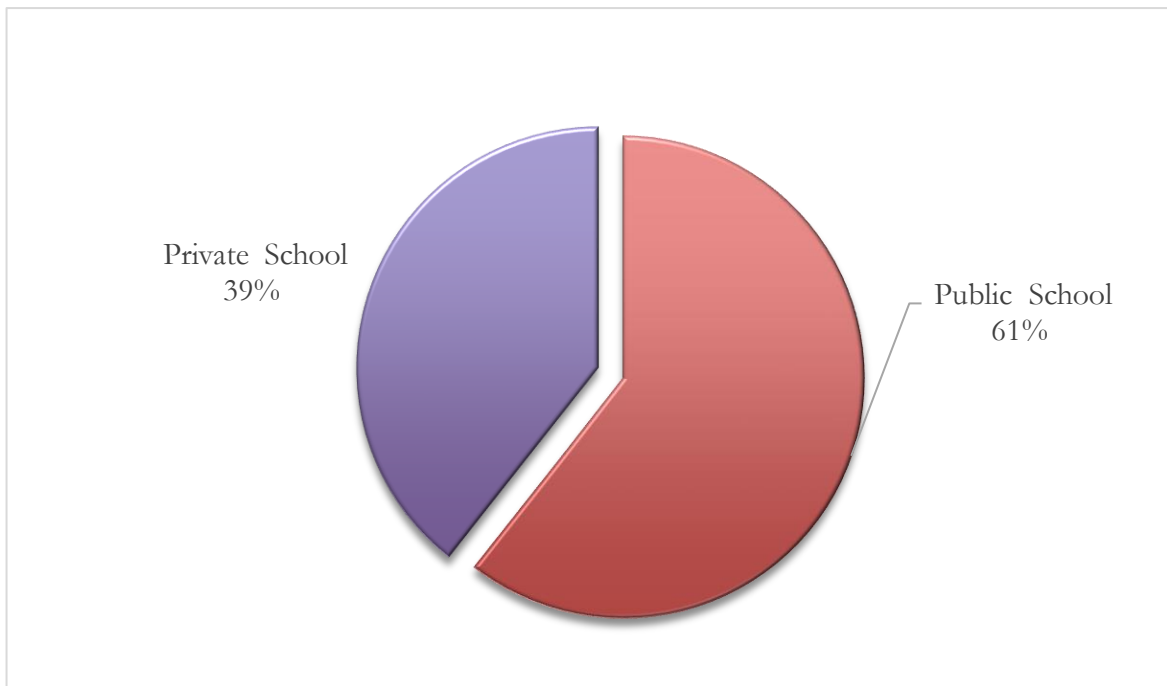

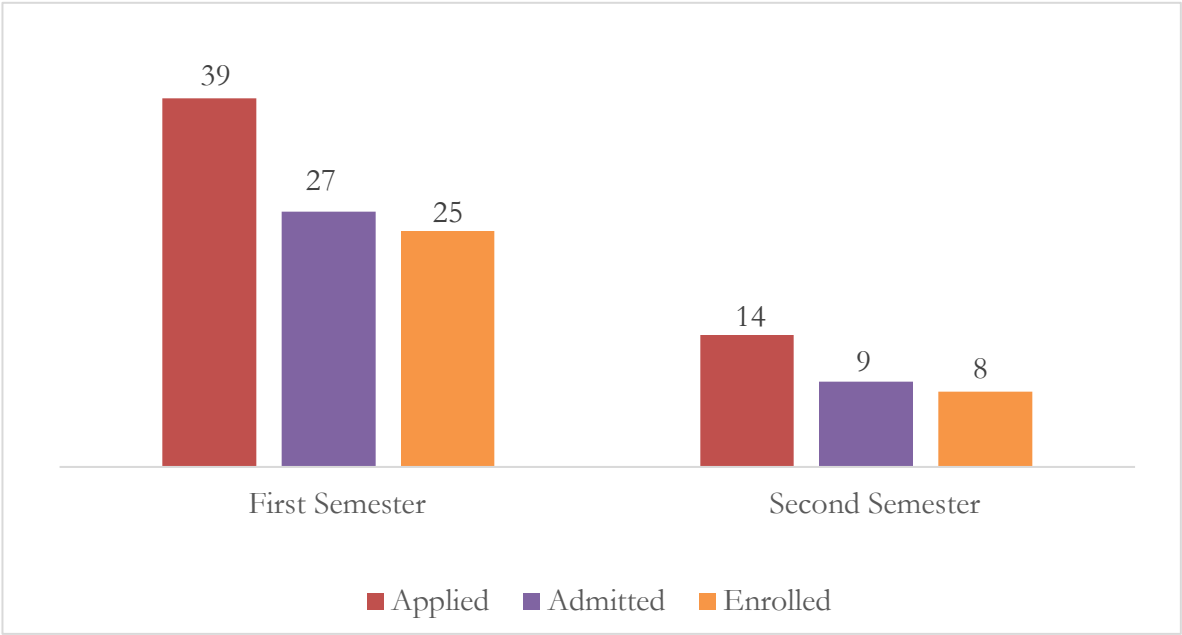

Figure 16: Application, Admissions, and Enrollment of Transfer Students from Private Institutions

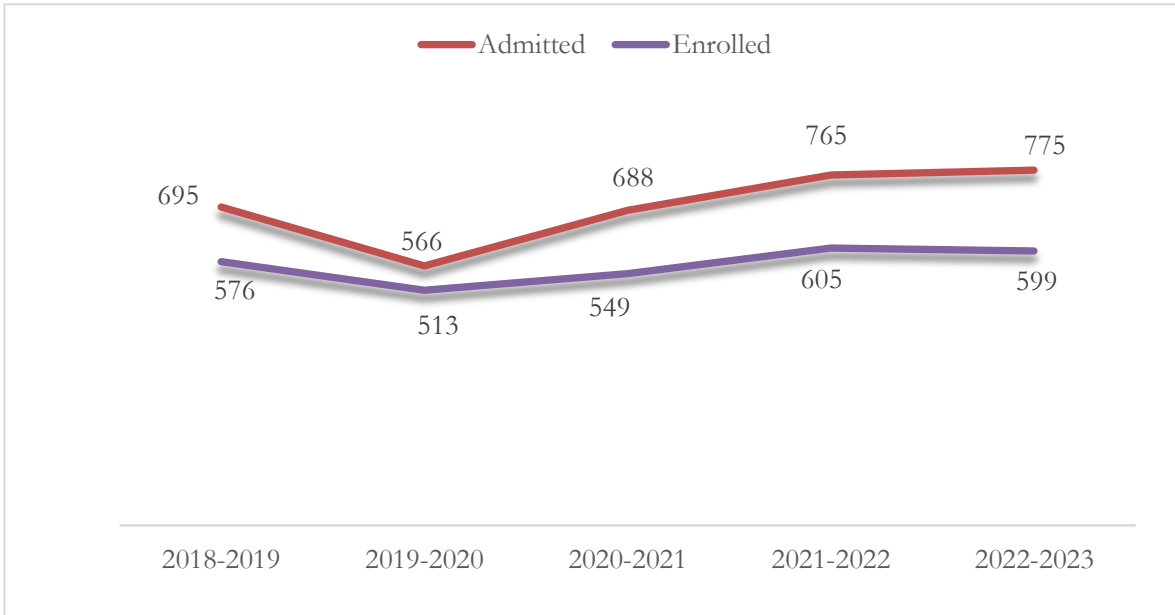

Figure 18: Degree Conferred by Program

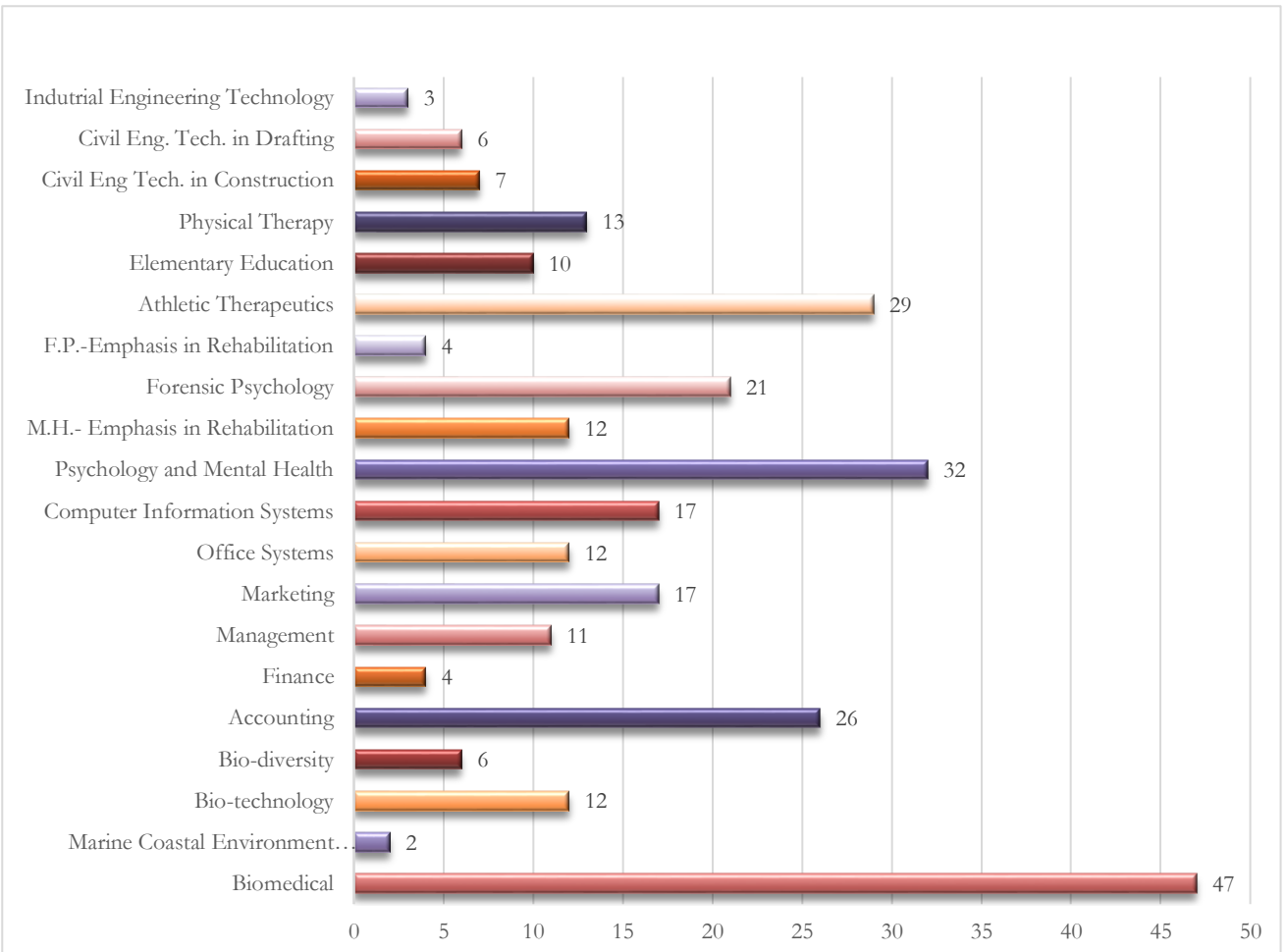
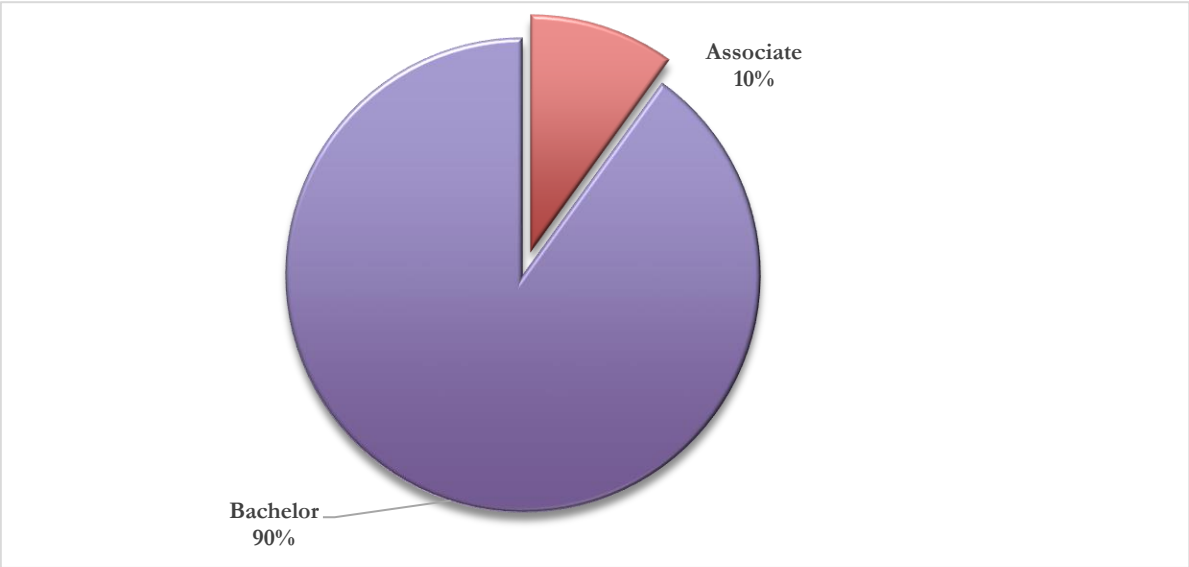

Figure 20: Distribution of Degree Conferred by Type of Degree

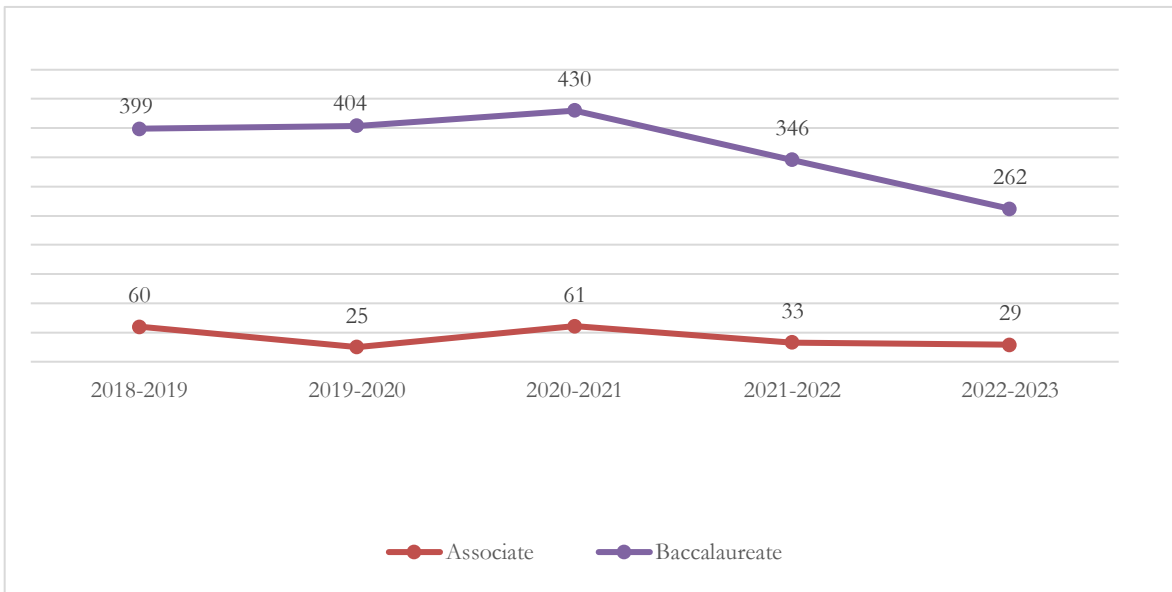
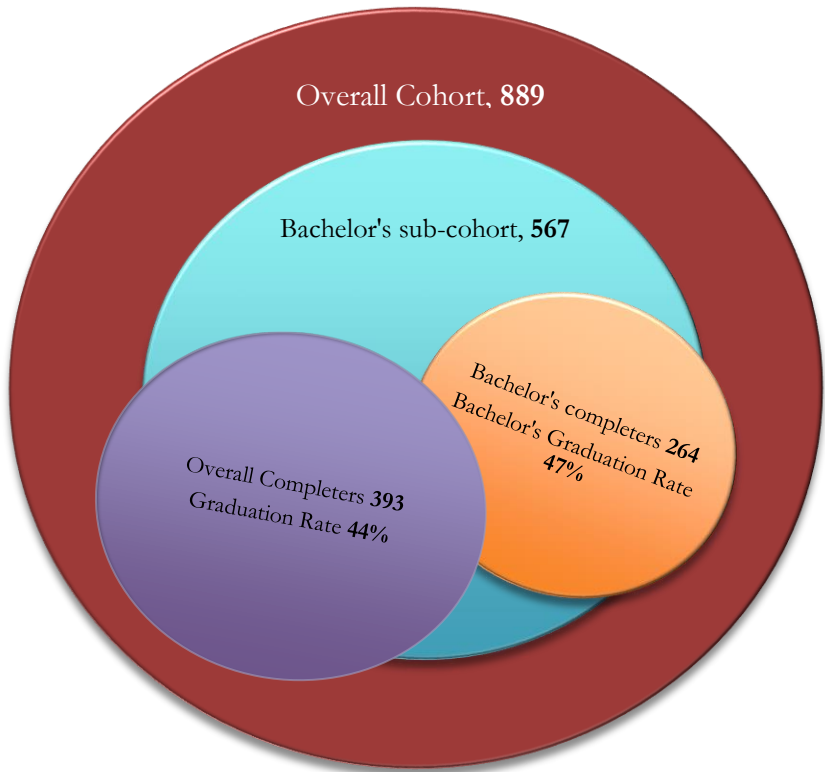

Figure 21: Graduation Rate Diagram

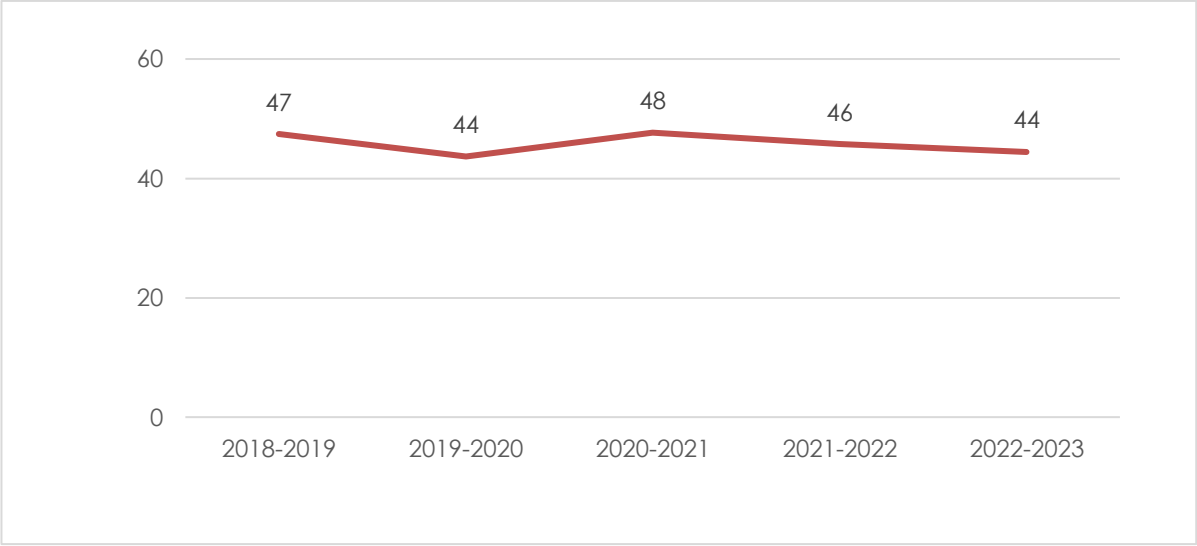

Academic Year 2022-2023**

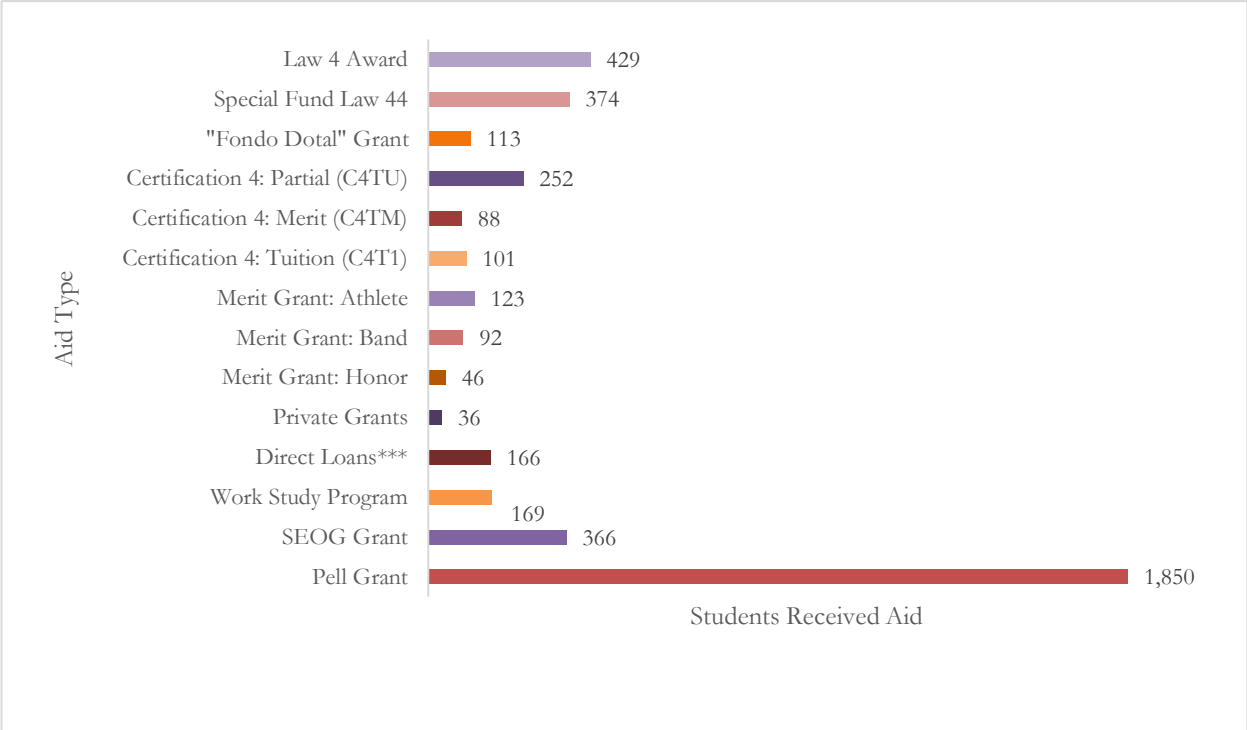

Figure 24: Personnel by Type of Appointment and Type of Employee

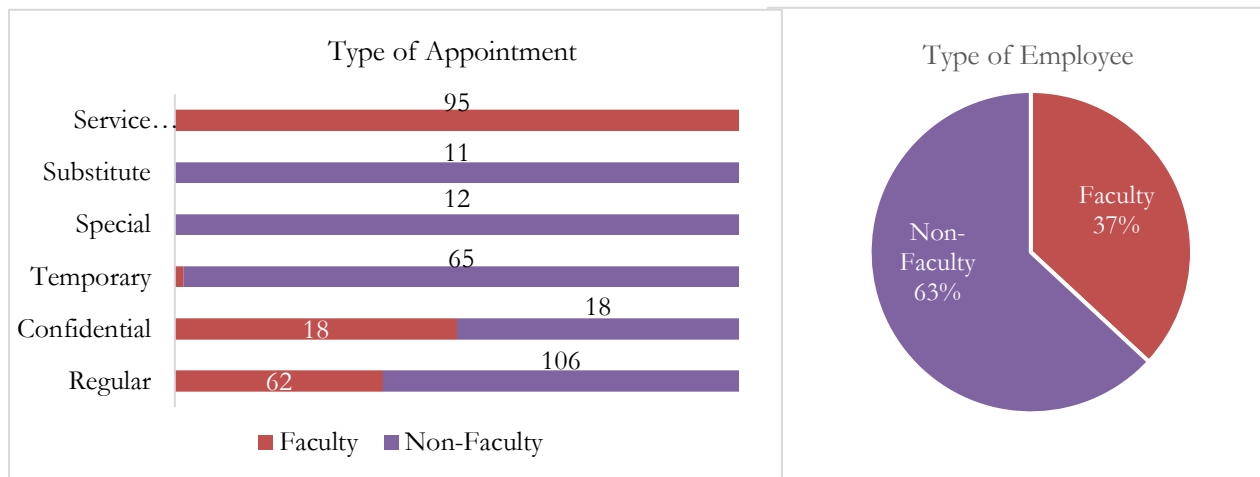

Figure 25: Distribution of Full Time and Part Time Faculty

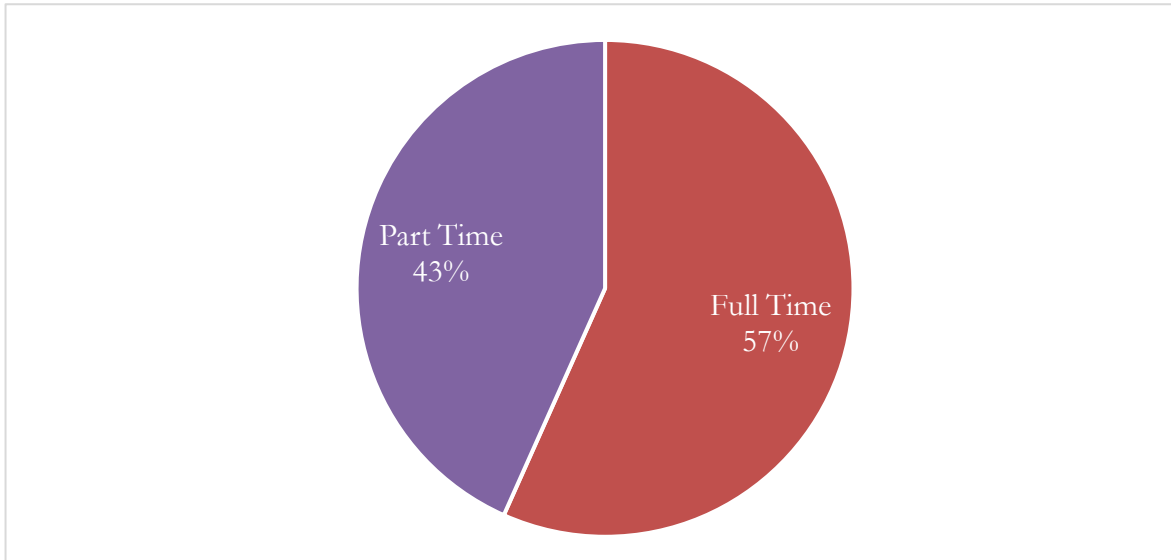

Figure 26: Distribution of Faculty by Academic Degree and Type of Contract

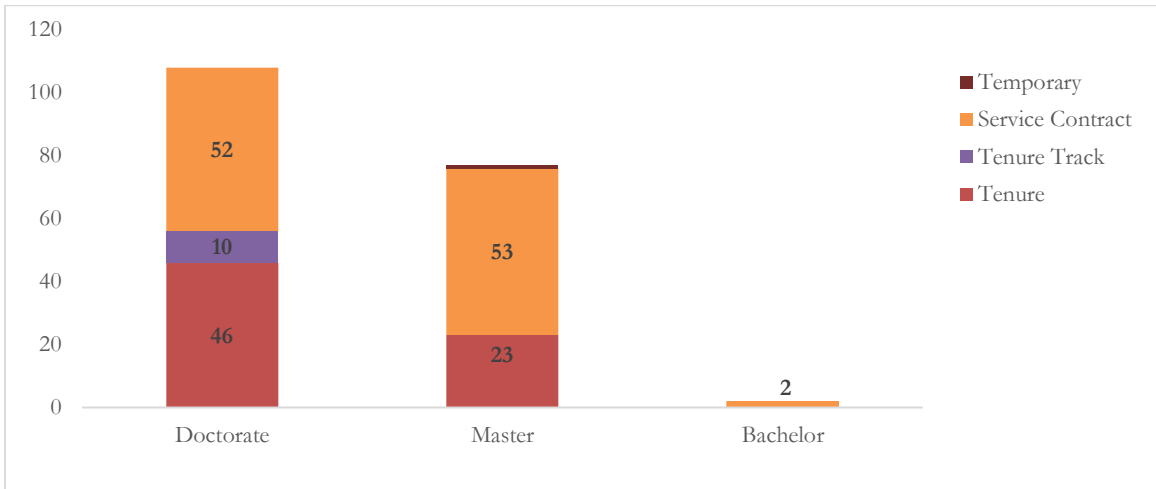


Figure 27: Distribution of Faculty by Rank and Academic Degree

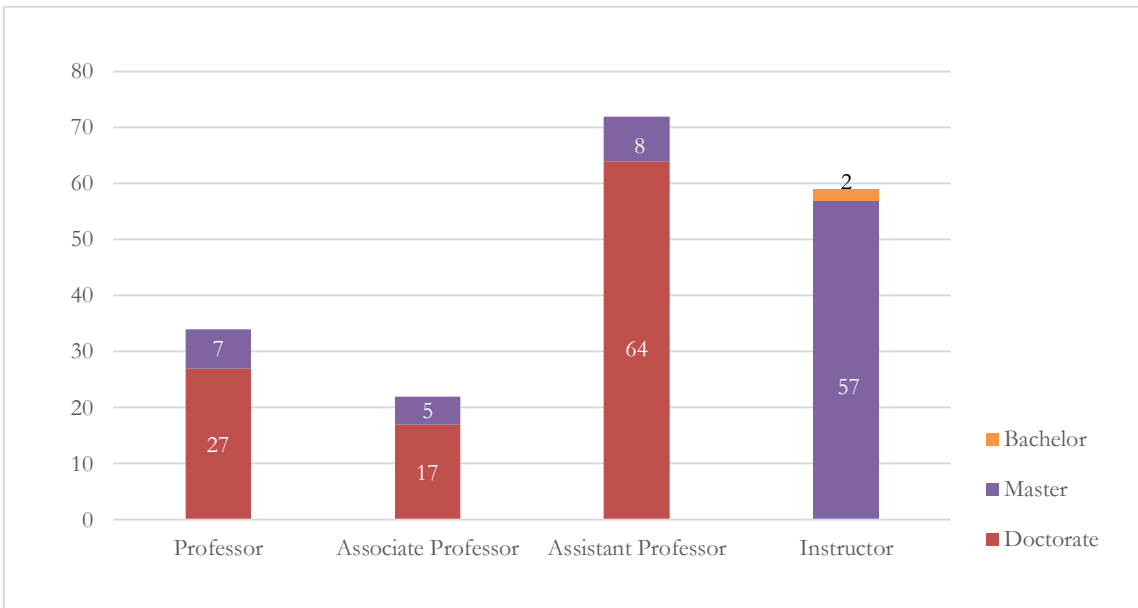

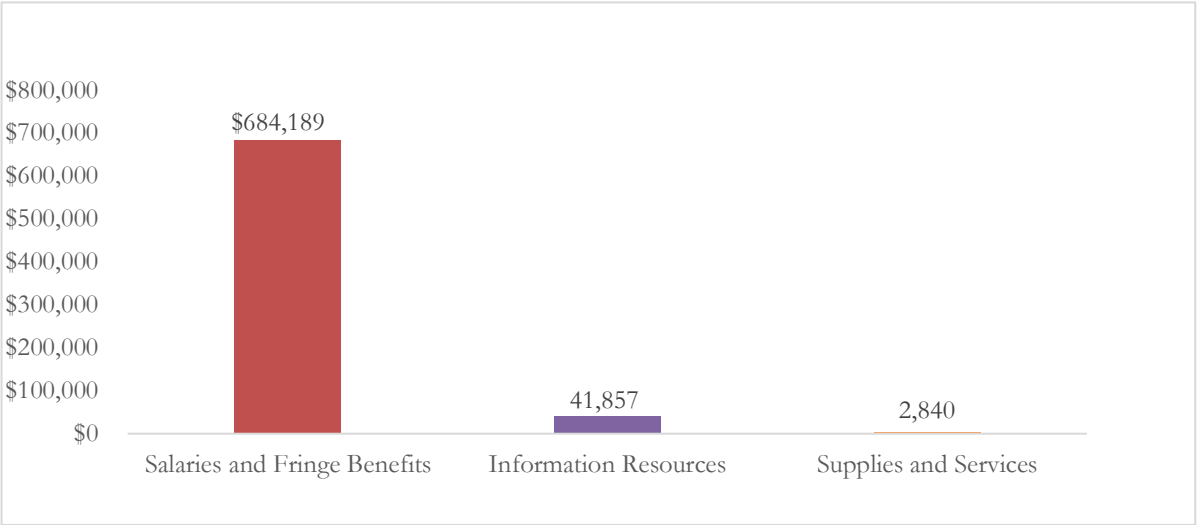


Table 54: Distribution of Library Expenditures

Figure 29: Submitted Proposals by Type

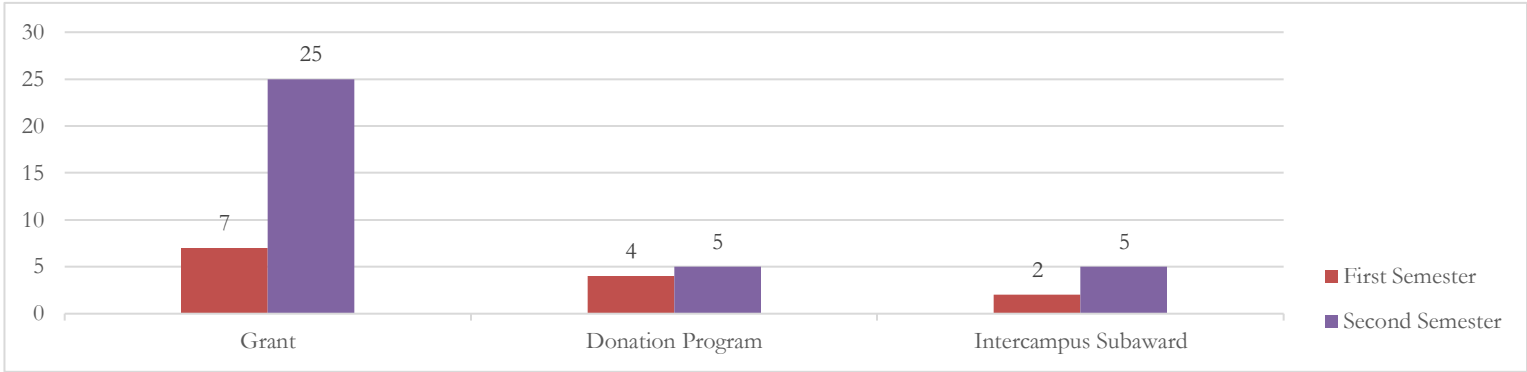


Figure 30: Proposals by Category

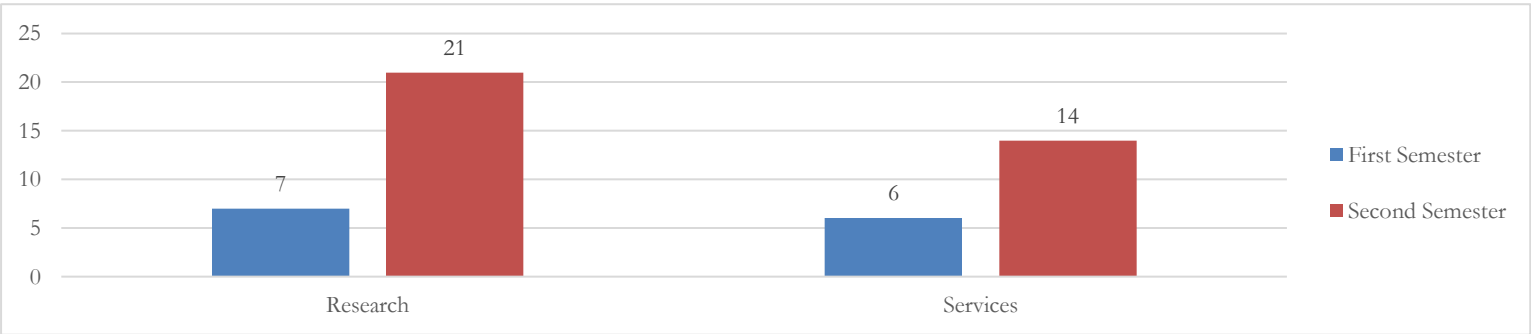
